

WHOLESALE FRAUDS.

A FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE.

An extensive and most audacious scheme for counterfeiting two popular medicinal preparations has recently been brought to light in this city. A few of the leading facts have appeared in reports of the legal proceedings growing out of the affair, but its comprehensive character, has been, but imperfectly developed in these brief statements. It would seem that the principal person implicated in this transaction is a drug broker named WILLIAM LEITH, lately doing business at 8 Gold street, and 5 William street, in this city, and residing at 4 Union street, Brooklyn. He had conceived the idea of establishing a factory for the purpose of counterfeiting on a wholesale scale, the most popular and widely advertised medicines in the civilized world, viz. HOLLOWAY'S PILLS and HOLLOWAY'S OINTMENT. This audacious project he intended to carry out in the city of New York, almost within hail, as it were, of the great central office for the sale of Holloway's medicines in this country. He had, therefore, ordered no less than 500,000 copies of the pamphlet or book of directions, around each box, and the printer to whom the order was given, supposing it to emanate from Professor Holloway, had no hesitation in executing the work. An accident led to detection of the fraud. Leith failed to meet an obligation he had given for a portion of the job, and the printer went to Professor Holloway's establishment, 80 Maiden Lane, to inquire the cause. Then, of course, the fraud was disclosed, and it was found, on comparing the counterfeit wrappers with the original, that the former were perfect fac-similes of the latter, with the exception of the water-mark which consists of the words "HOLLOWAY, NEW YORK AND LONDON," and is visible upon every leaf of the authentic pamphlet when held against the light. In all other respects, there was a perfect identity between the false document and the true.

Wm. Leith, the author of this atrocious forgery, was subsequently arrested, and fully charged, on examination before the committee, with procuring the printing and altering of the above counterfeits, but through an indiscretion on the part of the magistrate, he managed to escape from the custody of the officers, and is now a fugitive from justice. Professor Holloway's agents are on the qui vive to discover his whereabouts, but so far he has eluded their vigilance. He is a Scotchman by birth, and still preserves a little of the accent; his voice is deep, his articulation emphatic, and in speaking he gesticulates a good deal, and interlards his sentences with frequent oaths. His height is about 5 feet 3 inches. His person rather stout, complexion florid, light hair and thin whiskers, and his age about 35 years. His address is good and business-like. As it is not known to what extent he may have counterfeited the medicine, it would be well for druggists in the interior to beware of purchasing articles purporting to be HOLLOWAY'S remedies from irresponsible parties. There is one test of genuineness, which may however be relied upon: viz. the water-mark on the leaves of the book of directions accompanying, and on every leaf of the Ointment. If when the leaf is held between the eye and the light, the words "HOLLOWAY, NEW YORK AND LONDON," are discernible in semi-transparent letters, in the substance of the paper, then the pamphlet, or the medicines they envelope are genuine; if not they are pernicious counterfeits. Let this test be universally adopted.

National Police Gazette New York.

The Washington correspondent of the New York Herald, under the date of Wednesday, April 8, writes:

The Chinese mission has been offered to William B. Reed of Pennsylvania. He has not accepted, but probably will. Mr. Reed is an old Whig, and was Attorney-General of the State in 1839, when Ritner was Governor. He has also been a member of the Legislature, and ran several times for Congress. He is a son of the General Joseph Reed of revolutionary fame, to whom was attributed the well-known saying that "he was a poor man, but the king of England had not money enough to buy him." Mr. Reed, to whom the appointment to China has just been offered, has also gained some notoriety distinct from his political reputation, by his controversy with Jared Sparks relative to the allegations made by the latter on the orthography of Washington's letters. He came out last fall for Boston, and was very energetic and efficient in his canvass. The Chinese mission will be a handsome recognition of his services, more especially when we take into account the importance which recent events have attached to it.

[From the Dayton Empire.] Correspondence between Hon. D. Campbell, and C. L. Vallandigham, Esq.

We lay before our readers the following interesting and piquant correspondence: DAYTON, April 8, 1856. EDITORS OF THE EMPIRE.—The Dayton Journal of this morning contains a copy of a letter addressed to me, by L. D. Campbell, relative to the pending contest, and delivered yesterday. Engaged in the trial of the "Cooper Will Case," I have not had leisure to reply at once, as I purpose to do at the earliest day possible. But as he has seen fit to hand over his letter for publication, for effect, without waiting for an answer, I enclose you, meantime, an earlier correspondence between us, which came to a sudden and abrupt termination, as I have failed to discover that the letter in this morning's Journal, is in any way a reply to mine of January 12, 1857.

C. L. VALLANDIGHAM. The following "Card" was published in the Washington Union on the 13th of December, 1856:

A CARD.—In the proceedings of Congress on the 8th inst., I observed that the Hon. L. D. Campbell is reported as saying that one negro vote was given in this district, and that that vote was cast for me.—This whole statement is an unqualified falsehood. Not one solitary negro or mulatto voted for me, as the testimony will clearly establish. This Mr. Campbell well knows. Instead of one, more than twenty mulattos and persons of color did vote in this district at the October election.

C. L. VALLANDIGHAM. DAYTON, Ohio, Dec. 10, 1856. At 3 o'clock P. M., the 12th of January, 1857, John G. Lowe, Esq., handed to me the following note from the Hon. L. D. Campbell:

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, WASHINGTON, Jan. 6, 1857. Sir.—On the 8th of December, addressing this House on the President's annual Message, I made the following responses to questions propounded to me by members. I extracted them from the official report as published in the Congressional Globe of the following morning, (which is correct.) I send you herewith a copy of the paper:

"MR. CAMPBELL, of Ohio. I believe—and I have had occasion to look into this subject since—that there was one negro vote given in my own district; that is, a vote was cast by a man who, being more of the black than of the white blood, was not authorized to vote under that decision of our courts."

A VOICE. Who did he vote for? MR. CAMPBELL, of Ohio. I am credibly informed that he voted for my opponent.

I have to request you to inform me explicitly whether you have intended to stigmatize my statements as an "unqualified falsehood," or in any way to dispute its correctness. I do this because I observe in the papers "a card" over your name, dated "Dayton, Ohio, Dec. 10, 1856," which was, perhaps, called forth by an imperfect abstract of my remarks, which was sent out by Telegraph Reporters, and which is understood to be an assault upon my veracity.

On the same afternoon of the 12th of January, 1857, the following reply to Mr. Campbell's note was delivered by Mr. Lowe, by my friend, Col. Edward A. King:

DAYTON, Ohio, January 12th, 1857. Sir.—Yours of the 6th inst. has just been handed to me by John G. Lowe, Esq.

In reply: My Card of December 10, 1856, published in the Washington Union of the 13th of December, one month ago to-morrow, was predicated on an abstract of your remarks in the New York Herald of December 9, 1856, containing the assertion that one negro vote had been cast for me. I am not aware of anything in that card requiring interpretation. It was intended to charge the station: not published as an "unqualified falsehood," and thereby to dispute its correctness. I did not see the official report of your speech with the qualification annexed, till three weeks later. Nor did I at the time, know that you had intimated that I had in the recent canvass in this district, in any way or to any extent evaded the issues, and especially had contended that "the friends of freedom for Kansas" would have in me a better and more reliable friend on the floor of Congress, than in you, or I should have met the charge also with an equally explicit contradiction.

Yours, C. L. VALLANDIGHAM. Hon. L. D. CAMPBELL, Washington, D. C. With my reply to Mr. Campbell, this correspondence terminated.
