

The Affairs of the Seneca County Bank

The Columbus Journal of yesterday remarks:
We learn from headquarters that the cashier of the Seneca County Bank, at Tiffin, has deposited the sum of \$32,128.14 in the bills of that bank with the Auditor of State, to be withdrawn from circulation. This is the sum of the State bonds of that bank not yet returned to the Treasury, the bank to take upon itself the risk of their return to it. The \$77,000 of Ohio bonds found in the Treasury safe, and the \$100,000 of Ohio bonds just redeemed by Mr. Gibson of Atwood & Co., of New York, equal the amount of bank notes of the Seneca County Bank now in circulation, as appears by the bank registry books of the department.

The use of money.
The New York Mirror says it is estimated that out of our rich men (William H. Astor) has now an income of \$3,000 a week, or \$15,000 a month. He is the most contented man in the world. He is not. To keep away the gout he feeds himself on Graham bread and indulges in a less generous diet than we do. Astor, instead of being the happiest man in New York, is, perhaps, one of the most discontented. He is in law with his tenants half of the time, and instead of taking the world kindly, he spends eight hours of ten in reading upon the statistics of fraud. Astor's income is \$3,000 a day, and yet he could furnish all he consumes for \$15 a week. Such being the case, it strikes us that the man who makes \$15 a week is just as well off as Astor. People who worship money, place a false estimation on them. Three of the best things in the world are obtained gratis—viz: pure water, pure air and unadulterated health.

The New York Times predicts a fall in the price of sugar. Just now, there is a concerted movement among the speculators to keep it up, but it will not avail.
The prospects for a full crop are highly encouraging. The high prices which have ruled the past two years have stimulated production, while they have caused a diminution of consumption, and the natural consequences are, increasing stocks and a tendency to lower prices. Besides, the crop of Louisiana promises to be nearly four times greater than it was last year, and the yield of Maple Sugar has been much greater than it ever was before known.

The Spirit Rapping Humber.—The proprietors of the Boston Courier a short time since, challenged Dr. H. F. Gardner, the famous spiritualist, to produce some practical manifestation of their pretended power, with \$500 to be forfeited in case such manifestation should satisfy a committee, selected and approved by both parties to the contract. The challenge was accepted, and a committee named, consisting of Professor Agassiz, Benjamin Pierce, B. A. Gould, Jr., E. N. Horsford. After witnessing the experiments, and patiently investigating the thing, they have published a report, and express the opinion that any connection with spiritualistic circles, so called, corrupts the intellect, and leads to the intellect, and conclude with branding the whole thing as a "stupendous delusion."
