AN ORDINANCE
Of the city of Akron, Ohio, authorizing the issuing of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments, for the improvement of West Market street, from Kuder avenue to the west corporation line. Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio, two-thirds of all the members elected thereto concurring, that the Mayor and Clerk of said city, in the manner provided by chapter two, of division nine, of title twelve, of part first, of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of said city for the purpose of providing a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of improving West Market street, from Kuder avenue to the west corporation line, to the amount of \$25,000, and in the denominations and payable at the times following, to-wit:
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in one year from date.
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in two years from date.
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in three years from date.
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in four years from date.
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in five years from date.
7 bonds of \$500 each, payable in six years from date.
8 bonds of \$500 each, payable in seven years from date.
Sec. 2. That the said bonds shall be dated November 29, 1902; shall express upon their face the name of the street and the portion thereof to be improved; shall cite the State law and the City ordinance authorizing their issue; shall bear a rate of interest not exceeding 5 per cent. per annum payable semi-annually; shall be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and shall have affixed thereto the corporation seal of the City of Akron; shall have interest coupons attached duly signed by the City Clerk, and shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the National Park Bank, New York City, and shall be sold under the direction of the Committee on Finance of the City Council, at not less than their par value.
Sec. 3. That upon the sale of said bonds, the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the city treasury, and said assessments and all portions thereof when collected, shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest thereon as the same shall become due, and to no other purpose whatsoever.

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AN ORDINANCE
To levy a special tax upon all the lots and lands benefited by the construction of a sewer in and along Commis street, from Wooster avenue to Bowersy street. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Akron, Ohio: Sec. 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of constructing a local sewer in and along Commis street, as reported to this Council by Ebenezer Lewis, George Wetzel and T. J. Kelly, three disinterested free-holders of the corporation appointed June 17, 1902, for that purpose, be and the same is hereby confirmed, and that there be and hereby is levied and assessed on all the lots and lands and parcels thereof described in said report and in said ordinance to construct passed May 19, 1902, the said several amounts as in said report set forth.
Sec. 2. That the owners of the lots and lands and parcels thereof benefited by said construction upon which the said sums are assessed, shall pay the amount of said several assessments to the Treasurer of the city of Akron, Ohio, in three (3) equal, annual installments, on or before the 30th day of August, in the years 1903, 1904 and 1905, or be subject to the interest and penalty allowed by law; and, in case of default of payment as herein provided, the City Clerk of said city is hereby directed to certify any unpaid assessment to the Auditor of Summit county, Ohio, to be placed upon the tax duplicate for collection.
