RECIPROCIITY

Was the Keynote of President McKinley's Last Public Utterance.

Washington, D. C., Sept. 27.—Reciprocity was the key-note of the last public utterance of William McKinley. Reciprocity is the topic that has already engaged the earnest attention of President Roosevelt and his cabinet.

Since Mr. Roosevelt voluntarily offered to follow in the footsteps of his predecessor and to carry the McKinley policies to completion, the reciprocity question is naturally taking precedence in the deliberative councils at the White House.
