**A FESTIVE KEY  
Has Been Making Things Lively in Squire McDermott's Court.**

H. Campbell and Jno. W. Davis leased a new building on Church street belonging to Mollie Williams, but when they came to take possession, Molly demanded they indemnify her against damage to the building in the sum of \$1000. They refused to comply with her request and she refused them admission to the property.

Thursday Davis brought an action of replevin before Squire McDermott for the possession of one key. Constable H. C. Posey replevined the article and J. P. Ward and S. C. Wilhelm were called upon to determine its value; which after due deliberation and with all formality they found to be fifteen cents.

Mr. Davis then gave his bond to the defendant in the sum of \$50 and triumphantly retired with the coveted key in his possession.

The defendant's counsel then appeared and filed a motion asking that the affidavit be quashed and the action be dismissed for the reason that the affidavit was insufficient and that the court had no jurisdiction in the case. However, before the motion was argued the defendant filed a redelivery bond in the sum of \$50, and the court ordered the key taken from the plaintiff and given to the defendant. In the absence of a Constable, Policeman Putnam was engaged to secure and deliver the key to the defendant.

Attorneys Guyton and Richards, counsel for plaintiff and defendant respectively, argued the motion yesterday before Squire McDermott, which resulted in the Court overruling the motion but allowing an amendment to the bill of particulars of the former, which ruling the defendant's counsel accepted.

In this status the case now stands. A final hearing will be had at 9 a. m. Monday.

The costs already amount to considerable and the case bids fair to find its way into Common Pleas Court.
