VILLAGE COUNCIL GETS DOWN TO HARD WORK

Much Business Transacted Last Tuesday Night That Means Improvement For Logan.

The Village council met Tuesday evening in regular session, and it was not easy to distinguish between the regular and the laborious recess meetings they have been having about every night for a few weeks.

Tuesday night all members were present and Mayor Thurness presided. Under opening and reading of bids, the bid of Chris Holl for the putting in the Canal Street sewer was re-read and formerly accepted, and the Mayor and Clerk authorized to enter into contract with the bidder, in the sum of \$250.

Under the head of petitions and memorials, the proprietors of the Mingo Terrace addition to Logan, presented a petition praying that the north end of Mulberry Street be extended through the lands of J. H. Perone by condemnation, and that the gentlemen presenting the petition would bear all the expense of the condemnation proceedings and the amount of damages that would be awarded the owners of the land.

The bill of Attorney J. C. Pettit for the prosecution of a case in the common pleas court of \$25.00 was laid over in the hands of the finance committee. The grading of North street has been a long discussed subject and the matter was taken up in earnest, Tuesday night and referred to the street committee with power to act.

A resolution was introduced by Councilman Ed Kleinsmith asking for a transfer of \$100 from the contingent subdivision of the Library fund to the purchase of books subdivision of the same fund. The resolution was adopted. Mr. J. P. Miller, of Fountain Street, was present and asked that the council take steps to take care of the surface water on West Hunter Street near Fountain Street.

The contract for the paving of Mound and Hill Streets was read and adopted by the council and ordered to be sent to the office of the Ohio Paving Co. at Cleveland for their approval. The work will begin about the first day of August.
