DARKNESS STOPS SECOND GAME

GIANTS TIED WITH YANKEES IN THE TENTH

Meusel Hits A Home Run With Groh and Frisch On The Paths

FORMER RED PLAYER MAKES HIS FOURTH HIT

Stengel Of Giants Is Injured And Is Forced From The Game

New York **POLO GROUNDS, Oct. 5**—Miller Huggins of the New York Americans has nominated Bob Shawkey for twirling duty today.

John G. McGraw of the Giants has chosen Jesse Barnes, who brought the Giants out of the depths of defeat in the championship games last fall, to work against Shawkey. Should Shawkey falter, Carl Mays will be called upon to relieve him, while "Deacon" John Scott was told to keep warmed up ready for action in case Barnes needed relief.

"The Yanks, even with Shawkey at his best, will need to bring to bear some hitting ability in order to win today's game," said Huggins. "We know," he added, "that the Giants are fighters and the only way to beat them is to wade in and play their game."

Today the Yanks are the home team and the Giants sit in the visitors' dug-out.

MANY ARE DROWNED; CROWDED OFF A DOCK

NORTH BAY, Ontario, Oct. 5—Forest fire refugees arriving here today from Haleyburg reported that between 50 and 100 persons had been drowned when they were crowded off a dock, where they were trying to board a rescue ship.

Another report brought by refugees was that scores had been injured and many trampled to death when flames swept the Catholic church and caused a panic among hundreds who had gathered there for safety.

LIVES ARE LOST; 6 TOWNS DESTROYED

OTTAWA, Canada, Oct. 5—The forest fires which have been raging for the past 24 hours in two regions of Canada, northern Ontario and the Valley of the St. Maurice river in Quebec, have cost a number of lives and destroyed six towns. The fires now threaten other towns unless rains come quickly.

Neighbors fearing the fire would get out of control called the firemen. There was no need for the firemen's services and the fire was allowed to burn itself out.
