Of Public Schools Of City For Two Years

Some New Regulations Regarding Athletics

The following are statistics of the public schools for the first months last year and this:

1909—Total enrollment 1558, average attendance 1494, cases of tardiness 92, number neither absent nor tardy 1132, per cent of attendance 97, cases of corporal punishment 29, visits to parents 378, visitors 85.

1910—Total enrollment 1615, average attendance 1556, cases of tardiness 96, number neither absent nor tardy 1078, per cent of attendance 98, cases of corporal punishment 17, visits to parents 578, visitors 118.

The reports of the standing of elementary pupils have been sent to the homes. The high school pupils now receive monthly reports which they are expected to have signed by the parents.

A new regulation in connection with high school athletics, required by the state board of control, is that parents give their written consent and the boy furnish a certificate from a physician stating that he is physically fit, before he is allowed to play football.

More parents have visited the regular school work this last month than ever before in one month, and the teachers hope the number will increase each month.

CHOLERA PATIENT DIES IN QUARANTINE

Dread Plague Knocks at Doors of New York.

New York, Oct. 5.—One death of cholera in quarantine here of a passenger who arrived by the steamship Germania from Marseilles and Naples, and a death at sea, apparently from cholera, on the steamship Sant Anna from Marseilles, Naples and Palermo, now in quarantine, led Health Officer Doty to give out a statement about the emergency that is delaying the landing here of passengers from steamships that touch the infected European coast.

Three steamships from Mediterranean points are held in quarantine under observation, the Moltke of the Hamburg-American line, the Sant Anna, a new Fabre line boat, and the steamship Virginia.

Church Free From Debt

Archbishop Farley Officiates at St. Patrick's Consecration.

New York, Oct. 5.—The consecration services which mark the freeing of St. Patrick's cathedral from debt began at 5:30 this morning, when Archbishop Farley, who has fasted since midnight on Monday, marched at the head of a procession from the archiepiscopal residence to the cathedral. The service of consecration dates probably from apostolic times, and is in a sense the continuation of the Jewish rite instituted by Solomon.

The essence of the service is the anointing of 12 crosses on the inner walls with the Latin "sanctificetur hoc templum," and if the consecrator should, because of his long fast or for any other reason, become incapacitated before this part of the ceremony has been finished, the whole rite must be repeated from the beginning.

Cardinal Vannutelli, papal legate, was a participant in the ceremonies.
