

AUSTRIAN EMPEROR FINALLY ABDICATES

Copenhagen Dispatch Announces Charles Gives Up Throne—Action Is Reported Many Times.

CAREER HAS BEEN STORMY

Ruled by Berlin Karl Breaks and Issues Federalization Decree—Makes Many Peace Efforts.

LONDON, Nov. 12.—Emperor Charles of Austria has abdicated according to a Copenhagen dispatch in the Exchange Telegraph company, quoting private advices from Vienna.

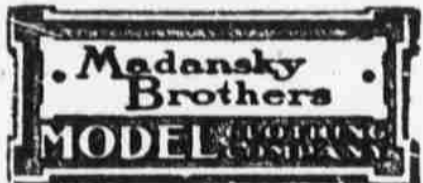

Born in 1887, Charles I was born August 17, 1887, the son of the late Archduke Franz Joseph of Austria. He married the Princess Zita of the Bourbon house of Parma (died in 1917). When the war broke out he was only 23 years old and was seen in the parks of Vienna wheeling one of his young boys in a baby perambulator. When he ascended to the throne on the 11th of October, 1916, Austria-Hungary was born by four years of war, saw the first faint gleam of possible peace.
