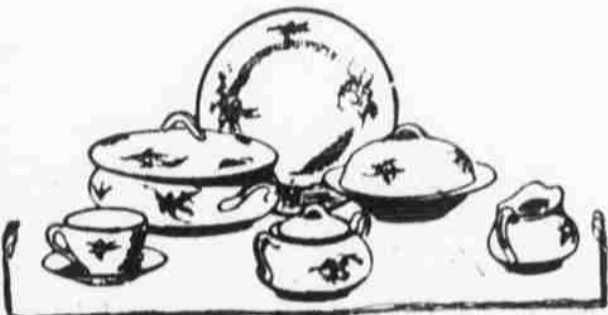

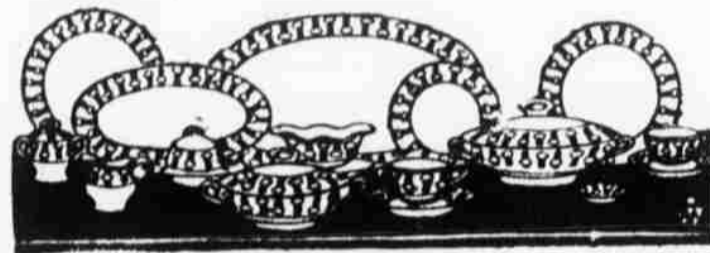

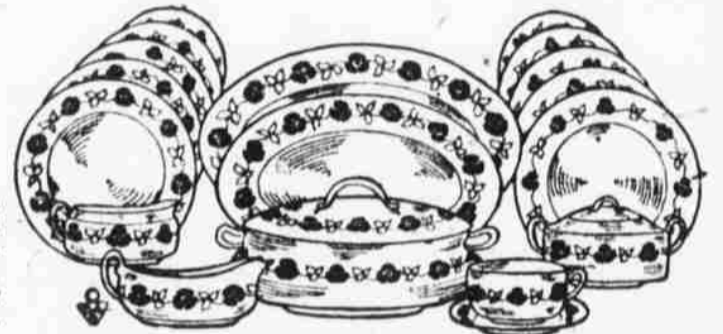

of its activities was promised by the committee, which stated:

"The committee will carry on indefinitely its manufacture in America and shipment to France of civilian garments and bedding, and will continue, at least for some months to come, maintenance of its traveling food distributors, dispensaries and civilian hospitals, motor service and the feeding and clothing of refugees."

The work of the committee comprises food production, community service, involving the rehabilitation of agricultural families in their old homes or in temporary shelters provided by the French government and child welfare work and education in manual training and domestic science. In connection with food production it was stated the committee co-operates with the French government in the distribution of agricultural implements, seeds and other necessities, and in "the furnishing of farm laborers, heretofore chiefly recruited from women and the non-military males of the devastated regions but hereafter to be supplied in part by the land army of America."

HOME SERVICE HELP FOR DISABLED MEN

Government Plans to Re-educate Those Who Have Been Wounded in Service to New Work.

Local offices of the home service department of the Red Cross have been advised by headquarters that assistance to discharged soldiers and sailors will also be regarded as one of the regular duties of the home service, in connection with the care of families of these men as long as is necessary.

Influence of the families of these fighting men who have been injured in the service of their country, should also be brought to bear so that these men will take full advantage of the government's plans, and thus be induced to help themselves. Information, encouragement and assistance during the time of training and in the early days of the new work is the part the home service is expected to play in the reconstruction period.

An outline of the plans of the federal government for the treatment, training and placement as well as after care of crippled and disabled soldiers and sailors has been arranged and the home service has been given due notice of the manner in which they may appropriately supplement the work of the official agencies.

Rehabilitation of the disabled, both physically and economically, is the responsibility of the national government, and is to be discharged like the payment of allotments, allowances, compensations and insurance under the federal laws. The vocational rehabilitation law was passed by congress and approved by the president in June, 1918, and under its provisions the government is assuming the whole responsibility of re-educating disabled soldiers and sailors when necessary for entirely new occupations, and finding them suitable positions.

It is the patriotic duty of every organization, every employer of labor and all citizens of the nation to loyally support these laws, and help make the government's program a success.

DOES NOT BELIEVE STATE WILL FEEL COAL STORAGE

ADA, Okla., Nov. 16.—Coal production figures, compiled at the office of state fuel administrator, P. A. Norris show that the September coal output in Oklahoma exceeded the output of September, 1917, by 44,398 tons. The total production for this month last year was 225,828 tons, against 379,826 tons this year.

Railroads did not require as much coal in September this year as they did last, according to the fuel administrator's figures. Railroad consumption and storage this year was only 184,404 tons, against 197,331 tons for the same time last year, showing a decrease of 12,927 tons. Commercial coal from Oklahoma mines in September of this year amounted to 119,477 tons, as compared with 94,467 tons in 1917.

Mr. Norris believes there will be no suffering this year in Oklahoma due to shortage of coal, if the present rules concerning conservation are strictly followed by dealers and consumers. Stocks, Mr. Norris says, should not be permitted to run low, for shipping facilities may again be tied up this winter, during the cold spell.

PILSUDSKI IS ENTRUSTED WITH GOVERNMENT TASK

AMSTERDAM, Friday, Nov. 15.—Brigadier General Joseph Pilsudski of the Polish legion has announced that the Polish regency council has entrusted him with the formation of a national government and control of all troops, according to a Warsaw dispatch received here.

General Pilsudski was arrested during the summer of 1917 while attempting to flee from Poland on a false passport. His imprisonment caused great indignation in Poland.

BASKI, Nov. 16.—The Galician socialist leader Daszynski, has been appointed premier of Poland and charged with the formation of a cabinet by General Pilsudski, according to a dispatch from Warsaw.

GERMAN ARMY FACES RUIN WHEN WAR CAME TO END

PARIS, Nov. 16. (5:35 a. m.)—Field Marshal von Hindenburg in his message to the German army said that the threat of famine caused the acceptance of the armistice, says Marcel Hutin of the Echo de Paris.

Although food deficiency played a part in the defeat of Germany, the determining cause of the German collapse was the fact that the enemy's army was on the brink of disaster.

"The first words the German plenipotentiaries said to Marshal Foch were in substance: 'Germany's army is at your mercy, marshal. Our resources are completely exhausted making it impossible for us to continue the war.'"

Sweden to Adopt Reforms. STOCKHOLM, Thursday, Nov. 16. The Swedish government has decided to carry out without delay a program of reforms giving the franchise to both sexes on equal terms and placing control of the foreign policy as well as declarations of war and peace with the riksdag.
