

### MARCH NOW ASKS ARMY OF 260,000

#### Chief of Staff Cuts Down Estimate of Force Needed.

### WANTS TRAINING PLAN

#### Universal Military System Is Advocated in Annual Report Made Public.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—A standing army of about 260,000 men backed by a universal military training system to supply reserves would meet the peace-time requirements of the United States, General Peyton C. March, chief of staff, declared in his annual report, made public today and which probably forecasts recommendations to be made by the war department when congress reconvenes.

General March founded his judgment on lessons of the world war. They proved conclusively, he said, that the ability to be self-sustaining for an indefinite period, provide the army was adequately prepared was the nation's greatest military asset.

So far as purely racial operations are concerned, he added, the United States has nothing to fear from "any conceivable combination" of naval powers, but must be prepared to prevent seizure of bases by an enemy controlling the sea and intent on landing troops.

"Without the possession of such bases in France," the report said, "we could not have landed our army, irrespective of the fact that the allies had control of the sea."

General March recommended fixing the strength of the regular army at five army corps, maintained at half strength in peace times. The proposals the department presented tentatively to congress during the special session called for 209,000 men and the statement of the chief of staff was taken to indicate that this would be scaled down to 260,000.

The report defended the present staff system with authority centralized in the chief of staff.

"The war produced new practices but not new principles," the report said, and "was not won, as some predicted, by a new and terrible development of modern science," but by "men, munitions and morale."

"The American military achievement was possible only because of the assistance of our allies," General March said.

### Russian Literature Urges Seizing Yank Ships to Aid Soviet

#### NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—Radical literature, including a Russian language newspaper urging seizure of American ships for the soviet government through military on the high seas, was taken in a raid on an east side communist party headquarters here today.

The newspaper urged communists to procure work on "any kind of transport vessels of the United States," giving the address of the United States transport service in Manhattan, as the place to apply for the jobs. Plans for military after the ships had reached the open sea included concerted action upon a pre-arranged signal, seizure of all arms and munitions aboard, imprisonment of the ship's officers, hauling down the American flag, holding the vessel against the nearest Russian soviet port.

A "singing reception" awaited successful raiders when they reached Russia with their craft, the newspaper said, and their comrades would gain for them the "favor of Lenin and Trotsky."

Manifesto, programs, constitution and reports to the "Communist International" were among the papers confiscated, portraits of Lenin, Trotsky, X. Joffe, bolshevik ambassador to Berlin, Maxim Gorky, Rosa Luxemburg and Karl Marx were found in numbers, as were communist flags, leaflets, tools and a huge red banner inscribed "The Flag of the Soviet Government."

The headquarters occupied two floors of a loft building, one of which was divided into class rooms for use in teaching the principles of soviet government, the police said.

J. T. Hunt, secretary to the attorney general, is expected to resign soon and it is likely that Hunt will succeed to the higher position.

Hunt returned from France in June and immediately took up practice of law. He was associated with his father and brother, W. T. and A. C. Hunt. Later he was named as special prosecutor to assist in bringing down and convicting auto thieves.

Hunt, who was a graduate of Georgetown university and who attended for a year George Washington University is well known in Tulsa. At one time he was secretary to former Congressman J. N. Davenport.


