

HIGH PRICES IS COST OF VICTORY

So Says Senator Gore in Address Before Kiwanis Club.

High cost of living and the league of nations were the subjects of an address of Senator Thomas P. Gore at the noonday luncheon meeting of the Kiwanis club yesterday, which was attended also by the various teams of workers in the Y. W. C. A. drive.

Characterizing the high cost of living as a part of the price of winning the war, Senator Gore declared the sole reason for the present high prices was the inadequate production of food. "I would like to see a law passed compelling all classes of people to work overtime from now until the time when production would again equal the consumption in this country," he said.

Inflated currency and government ownership were also given a share of the blame for the present conditions. "Government ownership alone encourages individual initiative, which in my opinion has always been one of the biggest assets of the country."

While he did not believe that the United States would reap any benefits from the covenant of the league of nations, Senator Gore declared that from the first he had favored a society of nations that would regulate international law, set up a code of justice and establish a court

of conciliation. He did not, however, favor such an arrangement that would necessitate a vast army to enforce its decrees.

Reservations were necessary, he declared, to clarify the terms of the treaty and to protect and preserve the rights of America. "I will never vote for any proposition that classes America as a sixth-rate power or makes the British empire six times as strong as the United States."

He believed that the soldiers who fought and died in the great struggle should have a voice in saying when they should again take up their arms. "I believe that the mothers and fathers of the boys who have the fighting to do should be the ones to pass judgment on the questions of war in the future," he said, declaring that future wars should be determined only on a vote of the people.

Senator Gore was introduced by Judge James H. Higgs, who in turn was introduced by Lewis Cline.

H. W. Grant acted as chairman at the meeting. Arthur Newland won the attendance prize, which was awarded by Dr. S. Murray. Reports of the Y. W. C. A. teams showed that more than \$12,000 had been subscribed of the \$200,000 asked for.

Drive headquarters in Hotel Tulsa were moved to the Y. W. C. A. building last night and from there the campaign will be continued until the total amount is secured.

Workers declared that the only obstacle was the shortage of workers and that with the names of some 2,000 people yet to solicit they expected to obtain the amount asked for.
