

### LAHMAN IS AFTER POSTOFFICE JOB

#### Husband of Prominent Republican Woman Would Accept Position

### PLANS NO CAMPAIGN

#### Mrs. Lahman Doesn't Want Place; Says Head of Tulsa Office Should Be Man

rumor that Charles E. Lahman, husband of the prominent local woman's political leader and chairwoman of the Tulsa county republican committee, is in the field for the Tulsa postoffice, was confirmed Wednesday by Mrs. Lahman.

**Wishes Her Claims**  
Mrs. Lahman stated that her own appointment as postmistress had been suggested by a number of local business men and women, and she was seeking a fitting reward for her services in behalf of the party during the campaign, but that she preferred to waive any claims which she might have to her husband. When people came and proposed that I seek the appointment, I said what I felt, that the postoffice, as a big business institution, should be managed by a man, and that instead of talking about me for the office consideration of Mr. Lahman would be more satisfactory.

**Plan no Campaign.**  
No active campaign for the appointment will be waged either by Mr. or Mrs. Lahman, the latter said. We did not propose it and will not consider any position or otherwise campaign for the position. A good many of the men have thought I should have some recognition and I am sure that the postoffice should be managed by a man, and that instead of talking about me for the office consideration of Mr. Lahman would be more satisfactory.

**Have no desire for political place.**  
If I had any work to do, I would not want to be recognized without my name for appointment. If Mr. Lahman is offered the appointment, he will accept it in order to put the postoffice on an efficient, smooth-running basis, but the only way in which either Mr. Lahman or I will turn our hands in the matter will be by mention of the matter to Mr. Postmaster upon his return from Washington.

### ROGERS SPEAKS TO LEGIONNAIRES

#### Explains His Attitude to Executive Committees in Meeting

The most effective work that any legislator can do is to the interest of his constituents in the present session, Rogers is to talk back into the legislature before they can be introduced in the house. Remington Rogers, one of the two Tulsa county representatives, told executive committees of the Junior Chamber of Commerce and American Legion at a meeting held Wednesday noon in the Kennedy restaurant. He was invited to be present to answer criticism directed at the two representatives by the Junior Chamber of Commerce because of absence from the meetings of the legislature.

Rogers stated that he has been instrumental in killing 35 bills. He has, however, introduced a bill waiting the operation of an oil lease a first lien on the interests of his partners who under existing conditions may not be held liable for debts contracted. This bill is of tremendous importance to the oil industry.

He explained his presence in Tulsa as often as due to the fact that the pay of a legislator does not warrant his entire neglect of business and that he has been compelled to come here several times to try important law suits.
