

### CHURCH CORNER STONE IS LAID

Services Mark Step in Construction of New Edifice.

### REV. KERR IN CHARGE

Home of North Side Community United Presbyterian Credit to City.

The corner stone of the north side community United Presbyterian church was laid Sunday afternoon with fitting religious ceremony. Rev. C. W. Kerr of the First Presbyterian church delivered an address on the text, "Thus saith the Lord, behold I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation."

The corner stone was laid by F. J. Gosling assisted by Edward Shroud, followed by prayer by the pastor, Charles E. Newcomb.

The corner stone was given by L. G. West of the Tulsa Marble Company. The programs for the service were donated by George W. Henry, printer, and the copper box which was placed in the corner stone was the gift of the Quick Plumbing & Sheet Metal Co. Deposited within this box were the following articles: The World, the Tribune, the United Presbyterian, the Christian Union Herald, the Youth's Evangelist, the Olive Plant, the Junior Missionary paper, the church directory and manual, a complete membership roll with the names of elders, trustees, teachers, officers, building committee and a copy of the Bible.

The free will offering of the Sabbath school yesterday morning was \$120 for the new church. The work of building under the direction of A. T. Hingle, contractor, is progressing nicely and with all possible speed.

The congregation and the church board are making great sacrifices in the building of this new church, which will be a credit to Tulsa. But they are not financially able to complete this work without some help from Tulsa's citizens. They are only asking, however, from them \$25,000 and are confident that the committee appointed will meet with favor and a hearty and generous response.
