

**WARNING ISSUED TO TULSA LEGION**

Captain Clark Advises Carefulness in Making Resolutions.

**WOULD DEPORT I. W. W.**

Resolution of State Commander Horace Hagan Is Adopted.

Think twice before you "resolve." That was the advice given Joe Charbonnet of the American legion by Captain Clark Nichols, executive committee of the state executive committee of the legion, at a smoker held in the municipal auditorium by the legion last night.

It is better that you fail to pass a resolution than that you unthinkingly let one be passed by the legion. Reserve your condemnations and endorsements. The American legion is the only organization that needs today that can be called entirely American. Therefore its endorsements and its denunciations will be taken all over the country with considerable weight.

Tells Rights of Legion. "Always apply this test. Ask yourself if the organization which you are endorsing is one that respects the American flag as its standard and one whose principles do not conflict with the principles of the constitution of the United States. If it does it should not be endorsed or condemned by the legion, but if it does not then the legion is within its rights to act regarding it as it sees fit."

Political parties should never be the object of any action on the part of the legion. However, organizations that are called political parties but are not do not enjoy this exemption. A political party has the definite theories of the government of the country under the constitution of the United States. There are some organizations that are called political parties that are opposed to the constitution and have as their standard the Red flag instead of the stars and stripes. These so-called parties should be vigorously and openly fought by the legion because they are un-American.

Mr. Nichols was introduced by E. H. Kinney, who formerly served in the same company of which Mr. Nichols was captain. In the absence of Post Commander John Rogers, W. L. Eagleton, Jr., vice commander, presided over the meeting.
