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DOMESTICS ARE AT PREMIUM

Quarantine Makes Servage Problem Hard to Solve For Some.

Quarantine restrictions placed domestic at a premium yesterday over 30 calls for housekeepers, cooks, nurses and other domestics remained unfilled at the federal state employment bureau last night following a steady stream of requests by phone, by messenger and by mail for a servant at once to take care of our family.

Trained nurses were appealed to in many cases to fill the vacancies caused by quarantine of numerous families. Nurses called to a quarantine house are put to considerable amount of discomfort in some cases due to the servants having been placed under quarantine as well as the other members of the family.

Alleged High Jacker Released.

The first year my salary was \$6 per week; second year, \$10 per week; third year, \$15 per week, and the fourth year the journeyman's scale, which, in my community, was \$18 per week. I was 18 years of age at that time.

At the age of 22 I was foreman of our shop, having from 15 to 25 men under my supervision. At the age of 28 I was owner of this same business. Having the desire, like most young men, of going west and growing up with the country and increasing my business, I therefore concluded to move to Tulsa in 1904, occupying the room now owned and occupied by the Exchange Trust Company.

The citizenship of Tulsa, or 75 per cent of them, have been responsible for whatever success I may have obtained during these years. Must I sacrifice my honor and loyalty to those citizens, who are members of the various organizations, most all of which I am a member? My answer is no.

How did I obtain the success above? By working eight hours a day, living in a modern house six blocks from the postoffice, eating high-priced meats, butter, eggs and cream, riding the street car or jitney for six blocks, insisting on seeing all the motion picture shows—hardly.

My success has been attributed to very few rules. I have learned the value of a dollar, I pay no attention to the clock, I do more work and do it a little better than the other fellow.

Labor has greater opportunities now than ever before. My advice to all men who labor is to practice some of the above suggestions and after due deliberation you will find out what you are best fitted for. Stick to it, devote all of your attentions and your best energies to your own success, in other words, mind your own business.
