

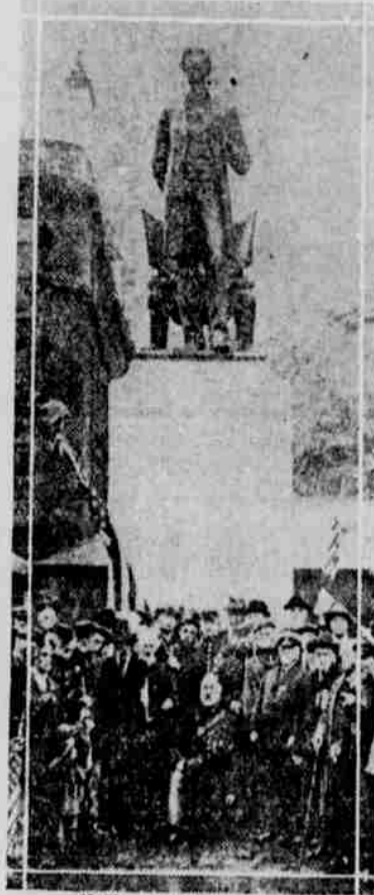

SIGNING FINAL REPORT OF LEAGUE OF NATIONS COMMISSION AT HAGUE FOR FORMULATING PLAN FOR PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE.

In the Japanese Room of the Hague Peace Palace. This plan will be presented to the League of Nations for final approval. The plan will give big powers five judges and small powers six, also four alternate judges making a total of ten. Judges will be elected by the concurrent vote of the Council of the League of Nations and Assembly of League of Nations which meets in Geneva on the call of President Wilson, November, 1920. 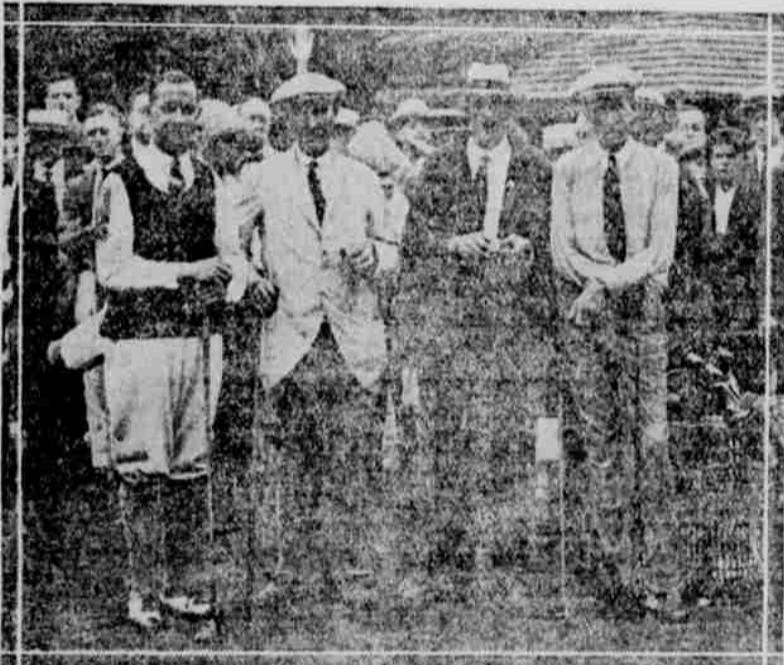

Soldiers on guard behind barbed wire entanglements in one of the streets in Belfast.



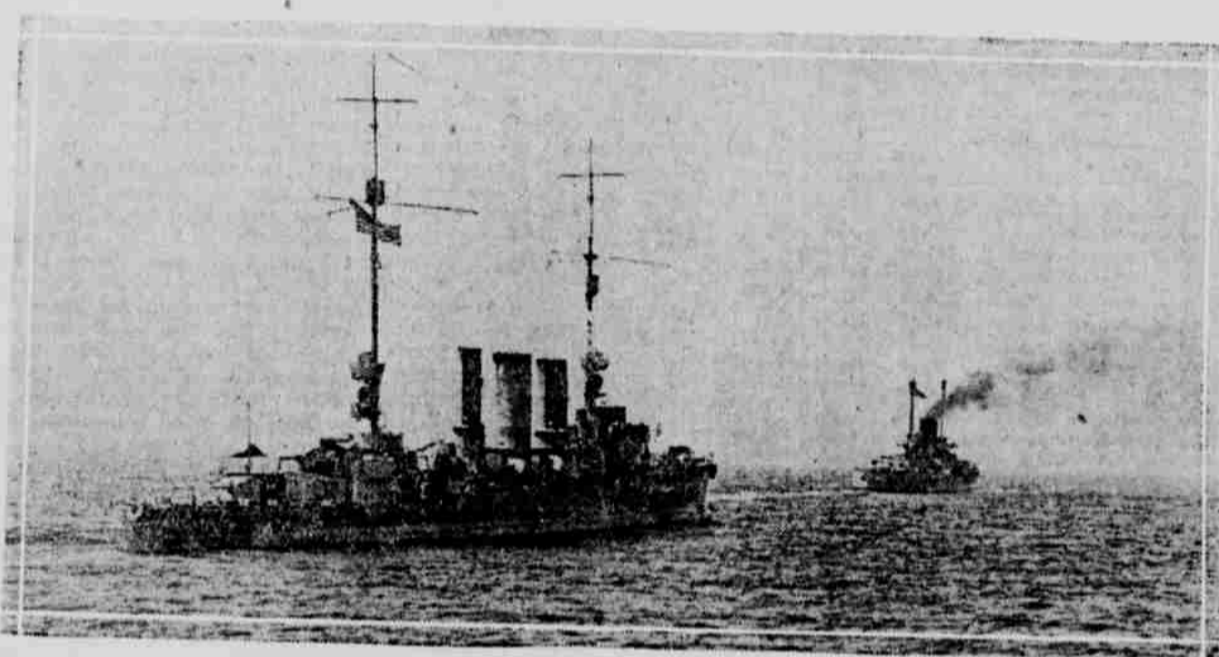
DAVIS CUP WINNERS CORDIALLY GREETED ON ARRIVAL IN NEW YORK

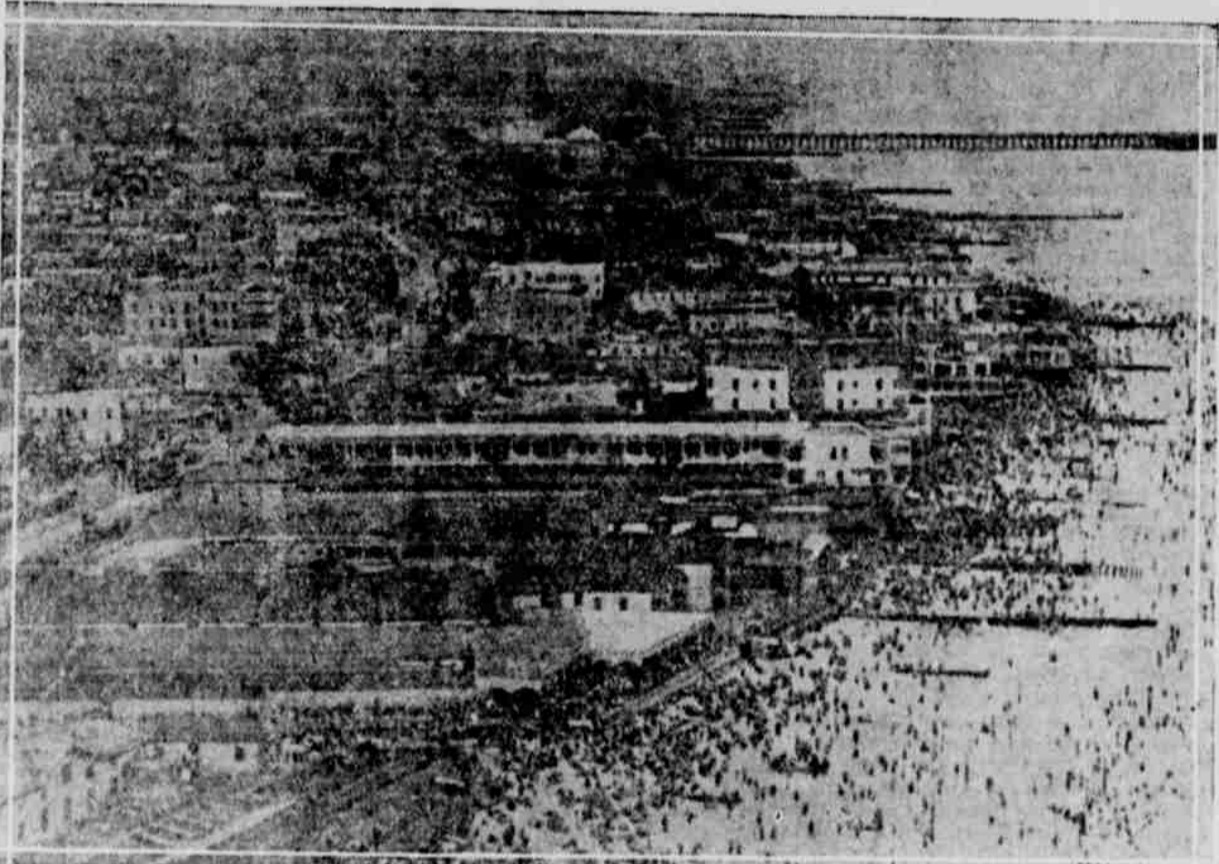


FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT AND SON

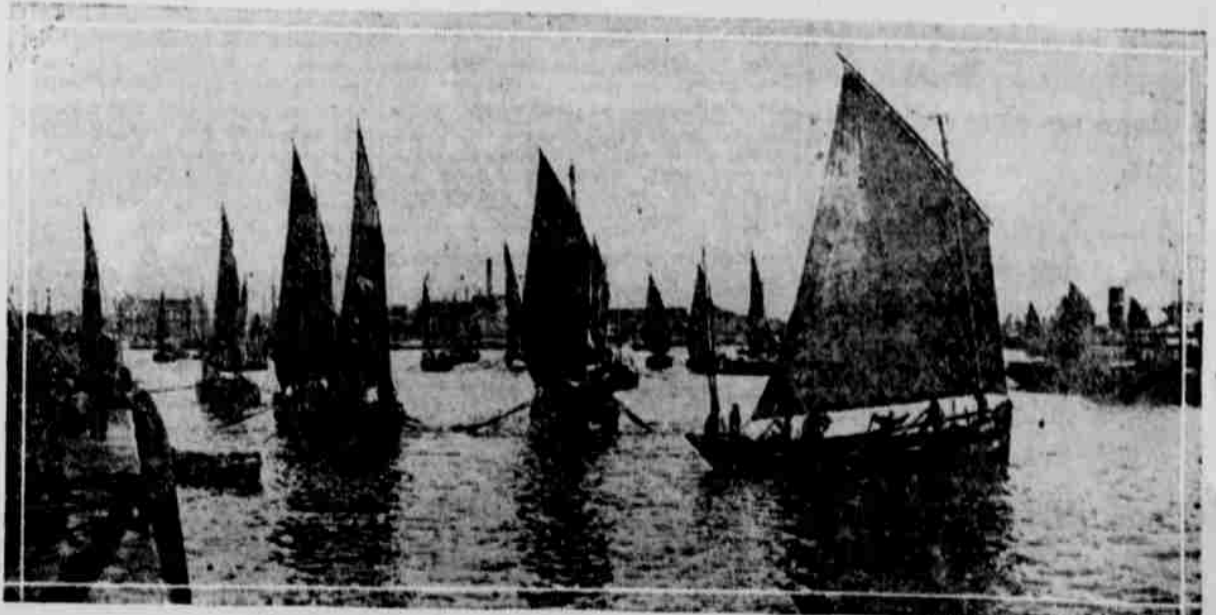
WINS U. S. OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP
