

CITY OFFICIALS PREPARING FOR ACCIDENT PROBE

Hefner and Dyer Not to Assume Arbitrary Stand, In Aftermath of Crossing Wreck.

Elimination of dangerous grade crossings is a popular topic for consideration since the accident at McLish avenue Friday night according to statements of City Manager Dyer and Mayor Hefner, and they are going to take action as soon as the question of the best manner of procedure is determined upon to have the menace removed.

Both mayor and manager do not wish to take any step that will seem arbitrary, they say, but they are determined to protect the lives of the people who are compelled to cross these dangerous places if possible. The question does not confine itself to the McLish avenue crossing of the Ringling road, but will embrace every railroad crossing in the city where an accident is likely to occur.
