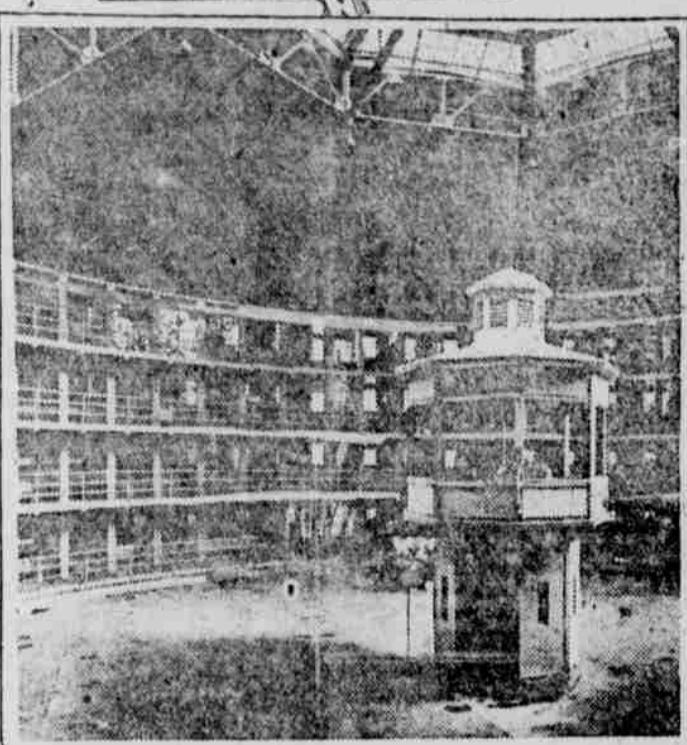

New Illinois Penitentiary Will Resemble Hotel With Private Baths and Everything

CHICAGO, Jan. 1.—Roads, railroads, and other public utilities, rather than cell, from air pulled out of the customary window, and secured with hot and cold water, and scores of other innovations mark the new Illinois penitentiary now nearing completion at Joliet.

The first of eight cylindrical buildings has been completed and shelters 248 convicts. Others will soon be ready and inmates of the old prison at Joliet will be transferred without delay.

The estimated cost of the new penitentiary is \$10,000,000. It is the first of its kind in the world. It was projected fifteen years ago, during the first term of Governor Denison.

Three commissioners have been appointed, Congressman Ira Copeley, John Lambert and James W. Patton, are still serving.

Largest Prison in World

The prison is the largest in the world. It covers 2,200 acres, on which sixty-four acres will be taken up by buildings and the remainder utilized as an honor farm.

The building is surrounded by a fifty-foot wall of concrete, a mile and a quarter long, the largest of its kind in the world.

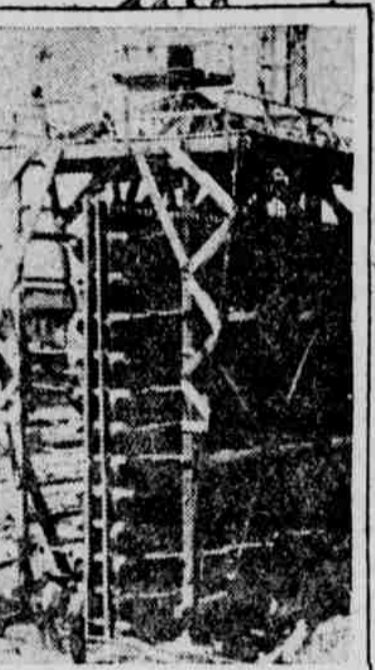
The wall will have a thickness of 24 inches at the base and fourteen inches at the top. The armed guards who usually patrol the perimeter of such walls will be housed, not at each of the four corners and at the railroad and wagon gates there will be water towers for guards.

There are no buildings near the walls and, as the walls are believed to be unscalable, it is claimed escapes will be impossible.

Sanitary and Still Safe In the old-style cellhouse sanita-

tion and health are sacrificed for security. It has long been realized that all inside cell accommodations have been decidedly unhealthy. The unique design of the Lockport cell-houses insures both the desired security and also healthy conditions of the occupants.

The buildings are all circular and the interior of the cells, which are against the outside walls of the circle, are visible from a central supervisory point at which a guard may be stationed. The facilities for complete and efficient supervision which this design affords, removes all danger of providing a large outside window to every cell. A prisoner attempting to escape would expose himself to the full view of the attendants. This feature makes unnecessary the usual heavy bars, and strong doors of steel and glass have been substituted



There is a room in the penitentiary for each inmate, prisoner will be allotted to a cell. This is also an innovation.

Inmates Get Every Chance The new penitentiary also is unique in the study of criminals with a view to doing away with the main tenance of discipline by force.

All new arrivals are sent to a receiving department to be examined physically and mentally and then kept for further observation, sent to a hospital for treatment, or put into classes of education and labor as recommended by the experts.

Prisoners are advanced from one cell house to another and finally to cottages surrounded by an iron picket fence instead of the concrete wall.

The idea carries out the parole policy, and enables the convict to live almost like a person in the outside world.
