Clear Mystery From Tomb of John Calvin

Geneva, Aug. 12.—The mystery which for three and one half centuries has surrounded the burial place of John Calvin, the great Genevese Reformer, is about to be solved.

Calvin's historian, Theodore de Beze, recounts that it was his master's wish that no memorial should mark the place where he was buried. This wish was faithfully carried out and when Calvin breathed his last in May 1564 his remains were interred in secret in the churchyard of Plainpalais, now within the city limits.

Since those days the secret of the tomb has been known to only one family that of Speyr, of Basle, in which it has passed down from father to son with the injunction never to reveal it as long as there were descendants in the family. The last of the race, Eugene de Speyr, who is over 70 years of age and lives at Avignon, in France, has just informed the consistory of the Protestant Church of Geneva that, having no descendants, he desired to reveal the secret of Calvin's tomb, which was pointed out to him in 1860, by his grandfather.

A meeting was accordingly arranged a few days ago between M. de Speyr and representatives of the Church and the cemetery was visited. Near the stone which bears the initials "J. C." as indication of the presumed site of the grave M. de Speyr, after some search, pointed out where the tomb should be. The city authorities have given permission for the site to be explored.

Triumph to Drill Stephens Test to 2800 Feet Report

Work has been resumed on the well of the Triumph Oil and Development company on the Short farm after a temporary shut-down and they are now drilling at 2,590 feet in brown shale formation.

This company got a sand at 2330 feet but the oil was a low gravity and it was decided to drill deeper and a second sand was encountered at 2,550 feet, a line set and everything was in readiness to bale out and work started when it was discovered that water had broken in and it was impossible to shut it off. It was decided to drill deeper and the contract depth of 2,500 feet was reached three weeks ago. Arrangements have been made to go to 2,800 feet and if no pay is encountered to that depth, it is likely the test will be carried deeper.

The 2 1/2 mile well of the Lone Star is 1/2 mile south of the Triumph well and this same sand may be encountered. Rogers and Edwards are the drilling contractors. They are owners of considerable acreage in the immediate neighborhood. Other tests will be made in this territory as the oil sand found is evidence that there is oil in this field and as the test is seven miles from the nearest production and will mean much to both Duncan and Marlow, according to J. M. Berriman, Secretary and manager of the Triumph company.

Likes Solitude More Than Cities

Edmonston, Alta., Aug. 12.—"I have been in civilization a year now and I am going back home as quickly as I can," said W. D. Clark, who has been a hermit in the Arctic wilderness nearly a quarter of a century.

Clark's "home" is on the headwaters of the Peel River, 180 miles from Herschel Island and 110 miles from Port McPherson. His nearest neighbor is 56 miles away. They see each other once a year. With the exception of this one other man Clark is the only human being in a thousand square miles of country. The Indians do not go that far north and the Eskimos do not come so far south.

"Once a hermit always a hermit," said Clark preparing to return to the solitude of his cabin in the wilderness. "A hermit wants nobody's pity. I wouldn't trade my solitude for all the pleasure and excitement of cities. I have seen 10,000 caribou in one herd. What have you in the cities like that?"

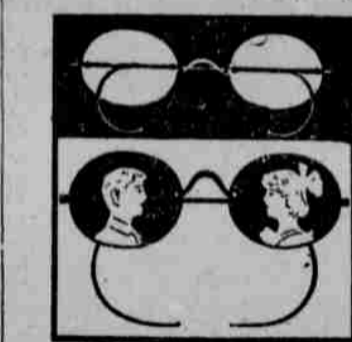
