KELLER 'RESTS' HIS CASE

Indications Are He Will Re-New Charge Before Committee of Next Congress

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Unwillingness of Representative Keller, republican, of Minnesota, to appear before the house judiciary committee in support of his impeachment charges against Attorney-General Daugherty will not bring the proceedings to an end but will result in a more determined investigation of the various "high crimes and misdemeanors" charged against the attorney-general, Representative Volstead, republican, of Minnesota, the committee chairman, announced this afternoon.

Two More Solons Wanted

Congressman Roy O. Woodruff, republican, of Michigan, and Royal Johnson, republican, of South Dakota, will be requested by the committee, Volstead said, to testify concerning all alleged delay by Daugherty in prosecuting war fraud cases, which was one of Keller's charges.
