RAIL EARNINGS REPORTED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30.—A supplemental appropriation of \$5,500,000 for modernization of battleships was requested of congress today by President Harding, who transmitted a letter from Secretary Denby indicating that as a result of the armaments conference in the three countries it was necessary for the navy to adopt a new policy regarding its capital ships if they are to be maintained at a standard of efficiency comparable to that of similar vessels of foreign powers.
