HEIRESS IS FOUND WITH HER WAITER

CHICAGO POLICE ARREST PHILADELPHIA GIRL IN COMPANY WITH FREDERICK COHEN.

SAYS IT WAS HER FAULT

Girl Says if Court Proceedings are Instituted Against Cohen, She'll be His Chief Defender—Grand Father Glad She's Found.

Chicago, Ill., Jan. 11.—Robert a Dejanon, the Philadelphia heiress, who was arrested here yesterday in company with Frederick Cohen, a waiter, said today that if court proceedings were begun against Cohen she would be his chief defender.

She was emphatic in her declarations that the elopement was all her fault.

It is expected that the pair will be taken back to Philadelphia tomorrow.

Grandpa is Delighted. Philadelphia, Pa., Jan. 11.—Robert Buist, grandfather of Roberta Dejanon, said today:

"I'm perfectly delighted to get back my little girl."

Regarding probable action as to the prosecution of Cohen, Buist referred the reporters to his counsel, Henry P. Walton. "You can rest assured that a charge will be made against Cohen and one that will stick," said the attorney, adding that he will hold a conference with the district attorney this afternoon.

THE GALLOWS FOR PRIVATE O'NEAL

SOLDIER WHO KILLED SERVANT IN HOME OF CAPTAIN AT FT. LEAVENWORTH TO HANG.

JURY REACHED VERDICT TODAY

The Crime Occurred on a Government Reservation and Kansas Custom Against Death Penalty Does Not Apply to O'Neal's Case.

Kansas City, Kan., Jan. 11.—Charles O'Neal, private of the fourteenth infantry, United States Army, was found guilty by the jury in the federal court here today of murder in the first degree, for killing Minnie Scharboro, a servant in the home of Captain Murphy at Fort Leavenworth, last July.

Judge Pollock imposed the death penalty. The crime having occurred on a government reservation, the Kansas custom of not inflicting the extreme penalty, does not apply.

The crime was a sensational one, created great excitement at the fort.

PASSES ARMY APPROPRIATION

BILL CARRYING MORE THAN NINETY-FIVE MILLION DOLLARS PASSED BY HOUSE.

OPPOSITION FOR THE EXCESS

The Bill Carrying an Amount in Excess of the Department Estimates Was Opposed by Many of the Congressmen.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 11.—Carrying an appropriation of \$95,200,000 for the maintenance of the army for the fiscal year 1911 the army appropriation bill passed the house today by a vote of 183 to 106. Present and not voting, 9.

The opposition was due to the fact that the department estimates were exceeded.

WILL MANEUVER AT FORT RILEY

MILITIA OF KANSAS, MISSOURI, IOWA, NEBRASKA, MINNESOTA AND TWO DAKOTAS THERE.

Omaha, Neb., Jan. 11.—Instructions were received yesterday at the headquarters of the department of Missouri to arrange for a maneuver camp and camp of instructions for the departments of Missouri and Dakota, to be held at Fort Riley, Kansas and a maneuver camp at Fort D. A. Russell, Wyoming.

They are to begin in September and continue for one month. The militia organizations of Kansas, Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska, North and South Dakota and Minnesota are to unite with the regulars at Fort Riley.

COSTLY BLAZE AT WEST MINERAL

TWO LODGE HALLS, BAKERY, AND TWO GENERAL STORES ARE DESTROYED.

Pittsburg, Kan., Jan. 11.—Fire at the town of West Mineral, near here, last night destroyed two lodge halls, a bakery and two general stores. The estimated loss is \$66,000. The Ross Dry Goods company lost \$25,000; Walbert & Tumberlakor, \$35,000.
