The Marietta School Superintendent Who Takes the Trouble to Tell His Mode of Punishment for the Boy Who Would Rather Sell the Air of Freedom in the Country on Washington's Birthday, Than to Attend Pink and Parties in Town

Facts as They Are. The statements appearing in your valuable paper of the 17th inst., under the heading 'The Revolutionary Spirit Still Lives' are so far as they have to do with the facts as that I am compelled to defend and in defense of the Marietta schools to ask your publication of the facts as I shall give them.

Because of the arrangements of the Executive Committee of the South-eastern State Teachers' Association for the Ardmore meeting should be held on Friday, Feb. 25th, rather than on Washington's birthday, as is the custom, the Marietta schools, in order to combine effective school work with TRUE PATRIOTISM, arranged for a patriotic session on the 25th, and a holiday on the 26th. Every room decorated the day with appropriate exercises at the morning and the entire afternoon was given as a time of rest and further celebration in attending a Washington tea given in the home of one of our best citizens. Flags floated over school buildings, rooms were appropriately decorated, and the true spirit of patriotism prevailed every where.

A petition signed by some thirty pupils out of an attendance of four hundred met our eyes when we reached the Marietta building Tuesday morning. It was taken up in morning recess in the assembly room; the pupils received an explanation of the conditions as stated above, and were asked for their opinion as to the advisability of having the session as arranged. Without exception all thought it wise. Fourteen boys failed to appear in school who had been on the grounds and signed the petition. These boys did not make the demonstration as stated, but went out to a farmhouse a mile from town, and spent the day. When these fourteen boys were arraigned next morning for truancy, they, every one, admitted their wrong and our fairness in dealing with the matter and it goes without saying that the Superintendent is as pressing out to them the proper attitude--a forfeiture of a full day's time during recesses and after school hours and 50 per cent of of each week's department grade. THIS IS IT EVER TO TRUANTS where the present superintendent of the Marietta schools has any authority.

I am sure that the statement contained in your article came to you as published, but knowing me as you do, and as every Ardmore citizen does, I wonder that you give space or credence to such unreasonable things. I ask for a correction and I am sure that you will do me the deserved favor to make it fully. We contend that these boys did not demonstrate the true American spirit, for that is True Patriotism: Loyalty, Respect for Authority, and all that goes with progressive school work. But a boulder weighing fifty pounds which had been hurled high over the house fell upon him, striking him in the ribs and crushing him to the earth, in falling his face struck a boulder and was badly bruised and disfigured.
