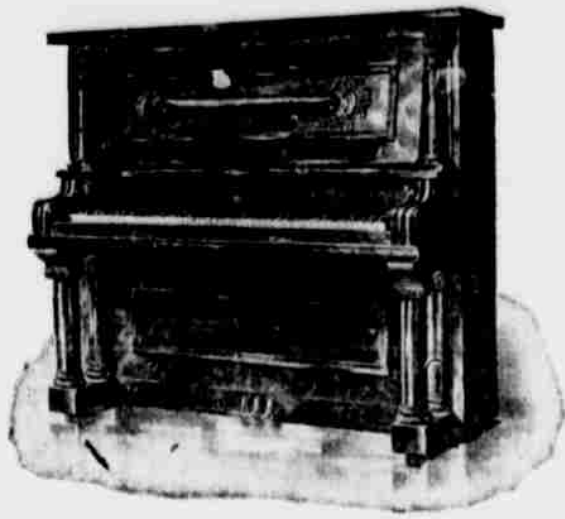

FOUR TOWNS CONSIDERED FOR CONFEDERATE HOME

ARDMORE IS ON THE LIST—COMMITTEE WILL REACH HERE TOMORROW.

Arrangements are being made to have a reception and other features for the committee who comes tomorrow to look at the sites offered here for the confederate home.

That either Ardmore, Muskogee, Claremore or Vinita will secure the Oklahoma Confederate home, was the statement, according to the Tulsa Leader, of Representative W. F. Gilmer, of Ardmore, financial agent for the Confederate association of the state.

The committee will meet at Oklahoma City August 2 to vote on the final selection of the home.

The main building of the Confederate home will cost \$30,000. Already over \$20,000 has been subscribed. The rest is forthcoming.

Muskogee has offered 20 acres of choice land and free water and lights for one year. Vinita offers 40 acres and an eight room house already erected. Claremore bids with 20 acres and a lot in the business district upon which to build a radium water bath house. Ardmore will offer a prominent site and other concessions.

The committee authorized to select a site for the home is composed of: Col. R. A. Snow, register of deeds of Comanche county; Mrs. W. T. Culbertson of Kiowa, president of the Oklahoma Chapter Daughters of Confederacy; Mrs. T. C. Harrell, of Wagoner; J. R. Pallman of Ardmore.

The home is to house indigent veterans of the gray. The association notified by the Sons and Daughters of the Confederacy, will see that the home is maintained.

ARDMORE AND MARIETTA CITIZENS WILL FIND OUT WHETHER OIL OR GAS IS THERE.

Marietta folks are as much interested in the oil situation as are the people of this section, even more so, for they are going ahead with active development work.

Yesterday Max Westheimer, Dr. Von Keller and P. C. Dings, of this city and Simon Westheimer and others of Marietta made a contract with Michael and Hammer to begin drilling for oil and gas on a large tract of ground adjoining the city of Marietta on the east. These gentlemen have secured lease rights to valuable oil and gas property and are going to lose no time in finding out what they have on it.

The contract calls for work to begin in fifteen days from this date. Mr. Hammer, of the company of Michael & Hammer, is a resident of this city and has large interests in the Madill oil field. The Marietta field is believed to be fuel oil and no refining oil has as yet been found there.

WHAT HE WILL TALK ABOUT OUGHT TO HAVE KEPT RLV. YOUNG AT HOME

ARDMORE MINISTER DEVELOPS INTO FIRST CLASS RAIN PRODUCER.

Many persons in this city know of the exhortive powers of Rev. J. F. Young, the well known Baptist minister, but they evidently are not aware of his rain-making abilities, or somebody would have been at work on him long ago. At least they would not have allowed him to have left the city.

The following is from the Durant News and gives an account of how cooling rain followed in the footsteps of Dr. Young when he visited Bennington and after the people of that vicinity had been wishing for rain for a long time.

A very recent joke comes from the city of Bennington, and as usual it is on the Baptist denomination.

Several weeks ago a Presbyterian evangelist erected a tabernacle at Bennington. They protracted a meeting for ten days, during that meeting it sprinkled rain a very little.

The Methodists then pitched their tent and they held services for ten days; during that time it rained once, a fairly good rain, in fact it poured for a few minutes.

The Holiness then commenced their labors to save the sin-stricken city. They continued their meeting for two weeks and during that time not a drop of rain fell; it was hot and dry and dryer and hotter, and it seemed as if the earth was going to burn and every growing thing die.

In desperation the people of Bennington decided that the Baptists were to be the leaders in this forlorn hope, and in lieu of their especial fondness for water it was thought that they might carry more weight, etc.

Dr. Young of Ardmore, a noted Baptist revivalist, was sent for and on Saturday night had his tent pitched on the Bennington streets. Services were held that night, but on Sunday morning it was raining. It was not a sprinkle, but was a regular downpour, and it kept it up for hours.

The strangest part of it is that the rain only extended a short distance out of Bennington in any direction except from the north.

It is needless to say there is a great work for Dr. Young in many localities and he will have more calls than he can possibly fill.
