HASKELL SPEAKS AT COUNTY INSTITUTE

DISCUSSES RELATION OF AGRICULTURAL INTERESTS TO DEPARTMENTS OF GOVERNMENT.

ARDMORE, Okla., Nov. 23. Annual meeting of the Logan County Farm and Institute opened today, the principal speakers being Gov. Haskell, President Council of the A and M College and President Connor of the State Board of Agriculture. Gov. Haskell talked on "Relations of the Agricultural Interests to the Departments of Government."

What he had to say, the governor told the audience, applied to no political party in particular, but that it was a result after abstractly applying recent political events to actual conditions in the west.

"I have been over two years trying to work out the problems of government," said Gov. Haskell, "and I know that my ideas are faulty, if they are."

He said that it was a matter of reporting that cotton was bringing 14 and wheat a dollar a bushel, but told the farmers that their energy in that direction depended upon how much of the price they were getting, and to illustrate the point, spoke briefly about the tariff levied by the recent congress under the theory of protecting infant industries. He said that it was to the credit of Senators La Follette, Cummings, Bristow and Gore that they did not believe in such a theory, for the farmer was compelled to deliver a part of the 14 and of the dollar in paying an increased price for what he bought, all for the sake of protecting infant industries. In this way the farmer was being used as a tool to swell the coffers of the eastern manufacturer, he said.

"It is to be hoped," said the governor, "that the western republicans and the southern democrat parties

lately those west of the Mississippi river, may stand together for the producer as they did this year. I have no more of an apology to offer to Daniels of Virginia than I have for Aldrich of Rhode Island."

He told the farmers that they were more in need of comfortable homes, free from debt than a county courthouse costing \$150,000.
