A skyscraper 62 stories high and which will be 909 feet above the curb, is planned by the Equitable Life Insurance Society of New York. President Roosevelt held another literary conference at Sagamore Hill last week. Col. S. S. McClure, the publisher, and Caspar Whitney, editor of Outing, were his guests at luncheon and the chief topic discussed was the African hunting trip which the President is to take next year. Many prominent publishers are besieging the President for the privilege of printing the story of his hunt. It is understood that his manuscript will go to a well known monthly magazine that has enjoyed the exclusive rights to his hunting stories. The publishers of this monthly, it is said, will finance the President's African expedition and pay him a handsome price per word for every contribution he sends back to America. It is stated that a prominent magazine has offered the President \$100,000 for the exclusive right of his story of the proposed hunt.

After trailing the German Protos car for nearly thirty days through Siberia, the American Thomas car has regained the lead it lost at Pogranitchnaya and is now a good day's journey ahead of its rival. The success of the Thomas car is due to the tremendous nerve of Shuster and Miller, its two drivers, who for the last two weeks have hardly eaten or slept, in their eagerness to overtake the German flyer. They have left for Oufa, which will take them through the Ural mountains. Better speed is expected from now on.

To determine what variety of chewing tobacco will serve the United States navy tars best for the coming year, a conclave of tars have been gathered at the Brooklyn navy yard to test all of the brands of which samples were submitted. On the result of these tests will rest the award of the contract for 100,000 pounds. The group of paymasters superintending the work besides directing the chemical tests as to purity will take a hand at the chewing from time to time. The test will last one week.
