### WILL EQUAL BRYAN.

 "I think I can make as many speeches as Mr. Bryan without any more effort or exhaustion," said Hon. Eugene W. Chaffin of Chicago, Prohibition nominee for the presidency, to me. "And I am not going to overlook Nebraska in the campaign. Already I have engagements for five speeches in Lincoln in four days next month. I shall emphasize there the political side of the Prohibition party and wake up the people of Mr. Bryan's home town."  
 "Yes, indeed," he continued, "I am ready at this moment to begin the campaign and would hold a meeting in Columbus to night if it were not for the fact that I am scheduled to leave town on an early morning train, and make it a rule never to miss a train. I have two engagements in Illinois, and shall keep at it until the ballots are cast in November."

These statements are characteristic of the Prohibition nominee. He is a great campaigner and likes the work better than almost anything else. He has given practically his entire time for the past eleven years to temperance. Mr. Chaffin is an optimist of the first water and unfailing good nature and superb health are also his. Those who have been closely associated with him in campaign work have never known him to become the least bit ruffled. He is able to see the bright side of any situation and his natural friendliness draws to him from the first. From personal experiences, his friends say, Mr. Chaffin does not know what a "grouch" is.

"Whether love steal through the senses or storm through them with the impetuosity of passion, its supreme joy is always for the spirit; when loves comes every hour is full of the intimations of the fathomless life which rises into consciousness in the soul of man," positively asserts a Kentucky exchange. Just so, but in days of old a little camomile tea and an occasional dose of yellow root bitters used to help some along in the spring when these symptoms developed.

Utah is a Republican state and will remain so as long as the Republicans are in alliance with the Mormons. The Mormons prefer to be Republican because they believe in Republican principles, especially that of protection, and they will continue to be protectionists as long as they are so largely interested in the production of beet sugar. But the Mormons might be Democrats, for they have been Democrats and voted that ticket in the days when Utah was wholly in the power of the church. Utah has sent Mormon Democrats or Mormon sympathizers who were Democrats as delegates to congress before the state was admitted. Then it sent Republicans who were Mormon sympathizers as delegates and as congressman and senators after the state was admitted. And it has had Republican Mormons in the senate. In fact, the politics of Utah, both as a territory and a state, has been intertwined about the Mormon church so closely that one cannot discuss politics without discussing the church.

Politicians who are trading on prospective appointments by Bryan, should be elected, will get cold comfort out of a statement made by him in that connection. When told that a report was current in Washington that former Senator Pettigrew of South Dakota was to be named secretary of the treasury in the event of Democratic success the candidate said: "There have been no promises of appointments made to anyone and there will be none. There will be no such dickering or trading, and you can state positively there will be no such thing during this campaign as apportioning offices before the votes are recorded."

### TRAVEL BY BALLOON ROUTES.

William Jennings Bryan, it should be borne in mind, has a brother Charles just the same as William Howard Taft, and brother Charles is right on the field of action. Nice thing this to have brothers to look after the bills, whether we spell them with a big or little B.

There is probably little more real publicity as to campaign funds on either side in this campaign than in previous ones, but somehow or other, there seems to be a ring of sincerity about the expressions of Mr. Taft on the subject. He talks like a man who was entirely willing that the people should know all about who pays the bills.
