RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST. 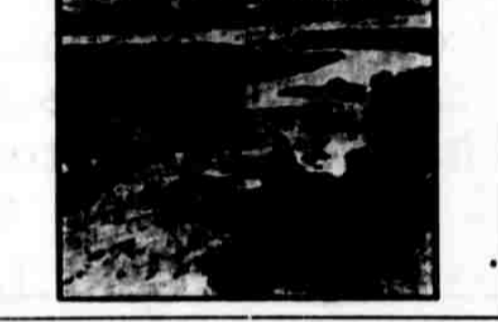

There is no more attractive steamboat trip on the entire Pacific Coast than that on Upper Klamath Lake with an altitude of 14,410 feet. The lake was first discovered in 1862, and for a long time was called "Lake Majesty," until the more appropriate name it now bears was applied to it. This is one of the places impossible to picture with pen or brush.
