 Secretary of the Interior has
 issued a departmental order of with-
 drawal in so far as the same affects
 withdrawal for irrigation purposes
 under the act of June 17, 1902
 (Stat. 288), for use in connection
 with the Klamath Project, Ore-
 gon, of the following described lands
 of the State of Oregon, and by his
 order such of said tracts as have
 been heretofore finally restored
 and not otherwise withdrawn, re-
 leased, or appropriated, will be
 set to settlement under the pub-

 on all such settlement or occupa-
 tion being forbidden.
