Almost three-quarters of a million dollars will be the gross receipts from the Texas onion crop this year. Had it not been for an excess of rainfall, which materially damaged recent shipments, it is expected the earnings would easily have reached \$1,000,000.

M. M. Johnson, of Portland, assistant secretary of the Equitable Savings & Loan Association and treasurer of the Columbia Life & Trust Company, was in Roseburg this week, looking into the possibilities for the promotion of an electric railroad between that place and Coos Bay. Mr. Johnson has no plans outlined for such a project; to use his own language, he is merely "seeing what the possibilities are." He left for Coos Bay Thursday in furtherance of his mission.

The wooden schoolship "St. Mary," after sixty years of service, first as a warship, and latterly as a schoolship in the service of New York, has been bought by a Boston firm for junk at a price of \$5,000, and is being broken up for the metal that is in her. Sixty years ago she was one of the fastest warships in the United States navy. From 1874 until October of the present year, when her place was taken by the "Newport," over 1,000 boys had passed through this famous old vessel, and graduated from her after taking a two years course in navigation and seamanship.

Unable to find solid rock bottom through which to carry a conduit under the Hudson River north of New York, near Peekskill, N. Y., it may be necessary for New York to erect a \$10,000,000 suspension bridge in order to perfect the new Catskill water supply system, now under construction. Such a bridge would have a span of from 1200 to 1400 feet, with a maximum height of 150 feet. Although if built it will be used primarily to carry the giant conduit, arrangements will also be made for traffic facilities. A tentative report on the proposed structure has already been submitted to the board of water supply.

Joseph Jacobs, of Eugene, was given the maximum sentence in the Circuit Court this week for violating the local option law. He was sentenced by Judge Harris to pay a fine of \$500 and to serve a term of 30 days in the county jail. This is Jacobs' third conviction of the crime, and there are several other indictments against him on the same charge. The judge announced when he sentenced him that the other charges will be prosecuted and that he will give him the maximum sentence each time he is convicted. Jacobs keeps a small store, and it is alleged that he sold the liquor there. Chas. Willman, a hotel clerk, was fined \$100 for the same offense.

Evidence of the profound impression made upon France by Wilbur

Wright's recent success with his aeroplane is shown by the statement in the Army and Navy Gazette that the French Ministry of Marine are seriously considering the placing of an order for a large number of aeroplanes of the Wright type for the Coast Guard Service. It is reported that a member of the Army Commission of the Chamber of Deputies, who witnessed Wright's feat of flying for over an hour with a passenger on board, stated that the aeroplane has now been developed to a point where it will be of great value for military scouting.
