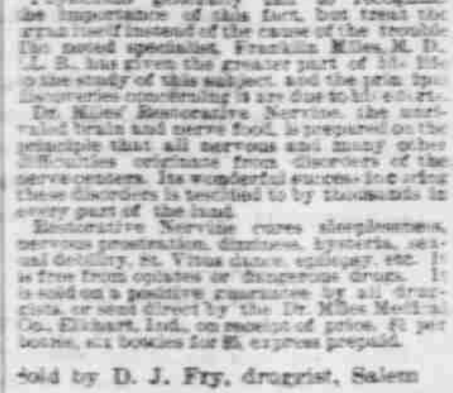

"That was sorter queer," said the other conductor, "but it was kinder lucky too."

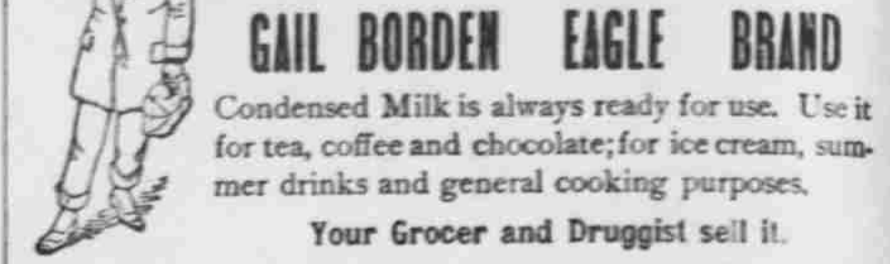
"How do you make that out?" asked the other conductor. "I don't see how the poor cuss was in luck."
