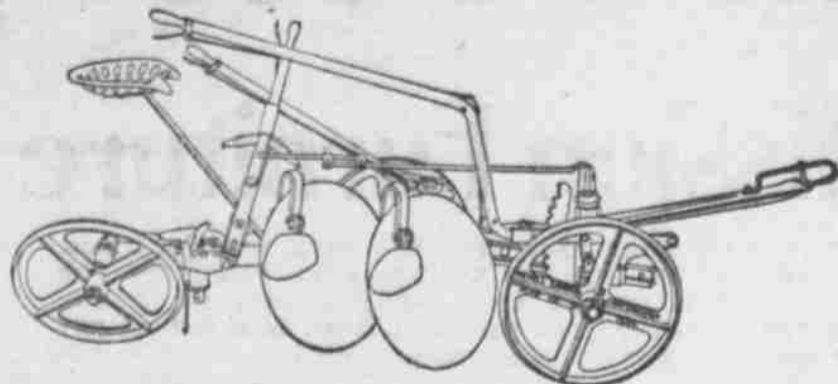

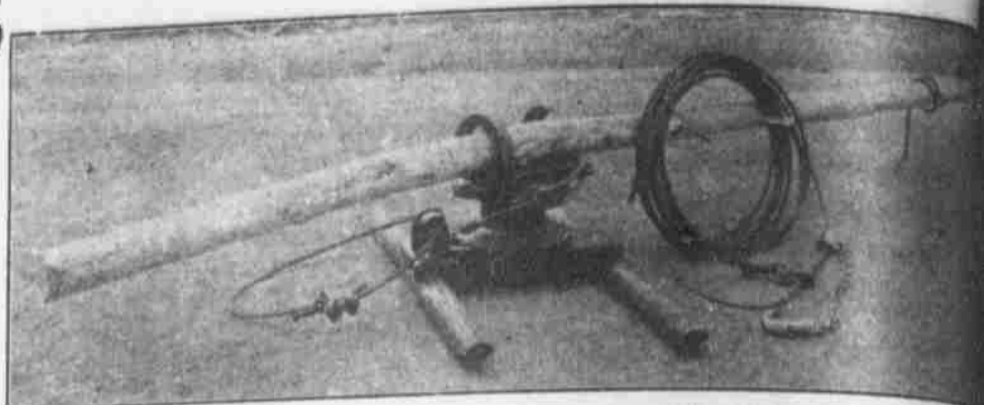

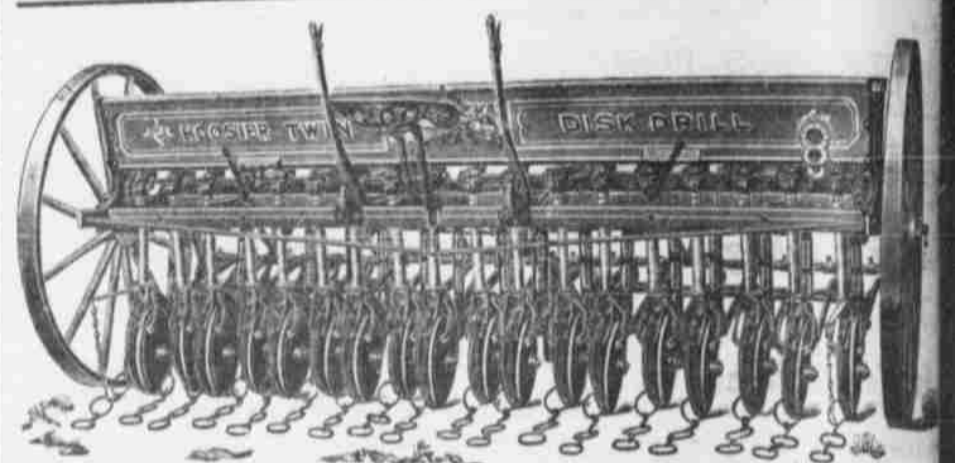
# Jumbo Stump Puller

floor in a speech nominating Hon. Harrison R. Kincaid and was compelled to extend his remarks for fifty minutes until the welcome relief came and the roll call proceeded to allow J. H. Scott to cast his ballot in an almost inaudible voice for Geo. H. Williams or some other conspirator, as they were then all called in the only Republican paper at Portland. A cheer went up from the galleries as Scott's

name was called and the 45 cast for Dolph were of no avail. But for the presence of Scott Dolph would have been elected, and as Scott has never got any federal office I take it he did it as a matter of principle.

#### The Final Roundup.

It is not the intention of the writer to review all that took place in that contest for forty days and nights, nor to analyze the motives of the participants. The Capital Journal was new in Oregon politics, and its publishers have learned some things as time has

passed along, and we have still a great deal to learn.
