

CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 264. An ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefited by the six-inch lateral sewer constructed along alley for the cost of construction of said sewer, and providing the manner of carrying said assessments into full effect.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause, if any, why said property should not be assessed for the construction of said sewer, and did fix a time for hearing any such protests, which notice was duly given in accordance with said ordinance more than ten days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protests against said construction or assessment of the cost thereof was made by anyone and said sewer was, by said council, ordered constructed.

And whereas, the cost of the construction of said sewer has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$1454.62.

Now, therefore, said city doth hereby ordain and declare that each parcel of property described below is adjacent to and benefited by that certain lateral sewer six inches in size, constructed on alley between C and D streets and Eighth and Ninth streets, and that the proportion of the cost of said sewer which each of said parcels of land should bear, based on the benefits derived respectively, by said several tracts of land is the amount set opposite the description of each such parcel below:

Assessment No. 1—Edward E. Gore, lot 1, and the south half of lot 2, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 75 feet on alley in rear of said lot; 75 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$33.75.

Assessment No. 2—T. A. Harris estate, the north half of lot 2 and the south 27 1/2 feet of lot 3, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 62 1/2 feet on alley in rear of said lot; 62 1/2 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$28.12.

Assessment No. 3—Anna M. Wilson, lot 4 and the north 12 1/2 feet of lot 3, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 62 1/2 feet on alley in rear of said lots; 62 1/2 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$28.12.

Assessment No. 4—W. D. Roberts, lots 5 and 6, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 100 feet on alley in rear of said lots; 100 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$45.

Assessment No. 5—James P. Hansen, lots 7 and 8, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 50 feet in rear of said lots; 50 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$22.50.

Assessment No. 6—L. A. Rhodes et al., lot 11, block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 25 feet in rear of said lot; 25 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$11.25.

Assessment No. 7—A. A. Davis, lots 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, in block 19, original townsite in the city of Medford, Oregon, frontage 175 feet on alley in rear of said lots; 175 feet; rate per foot 45 cents; amount due \$78.75.

Section 2. And it is hereby ordered and ordained that said several assessments and the liens thereon be entered in the lien docket of said city, and that thereupon notice be given the owners or reputed owners of said property, and that the same be enforced and collected in the manner provided by the charter of said city for the collection of assessments for the improvements of streets therein.

Section 3. It is further ordered that the notice above provided for be published three times in the Daily Mail Tribune, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, in the manner provided by ordinance No. 250 of said city.

ORDINANCE NO. 269.

An ordinance declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a 6-inch water main on Dakota avenue and directing the recorder to enter a statement thereof in the water main lien docket.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the city council did heretofore by resolution declare its intention to lay a 6-inch water main on Dakota avenue and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and did fix a time and place for hearing protests against the laying of said water main on said portion of said street and the assessment of the cost thereof as aforesaid; and

Whereas, said resolution was duly published and posted as required by section 116 of the charter of said city; and

Whereas, a meeting of the council was held at the time and place fixed in said resolution, for the purpose of considering any such protests, but no protests were at said time or at any other time made to or received by the council; and

Whereas, the cost of said water main has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$1909.44;

Now, therefore, it is hereby further determined that the proportionate share of the cost of laying said water main of each parcel of property fronting on said portion of said street is the amount set opposite the description of each parcel of land below, and that each piece or parcel of land benefited by the laying of said water main to the full extent of the amount so set opposite the description of the same, and that the respective amounts represent the proportional benefits of said water main to said respective parcels of land and also the proportional frontage thereof on said portion of said street, and the council does hereby declare each of the parcels of property described below to be assessed and each of the same hereby is assessed the amount set opposite each description for the cost of laying said water main;
