Portland Livestock Market

(From The Oregon Journal.)
Montana cattle came to Portland Wednesday and found an active demand. Hogs were steady for killers and weak for feeders, while sheep and lambs were on a nominal basis.

Good quality cows from Montana formed the basis for a rather active demand in the North Portland cattle alley Wednesday. Prices were fully steady in this division, this being the first really good aim in the cattle trade for an extended period.

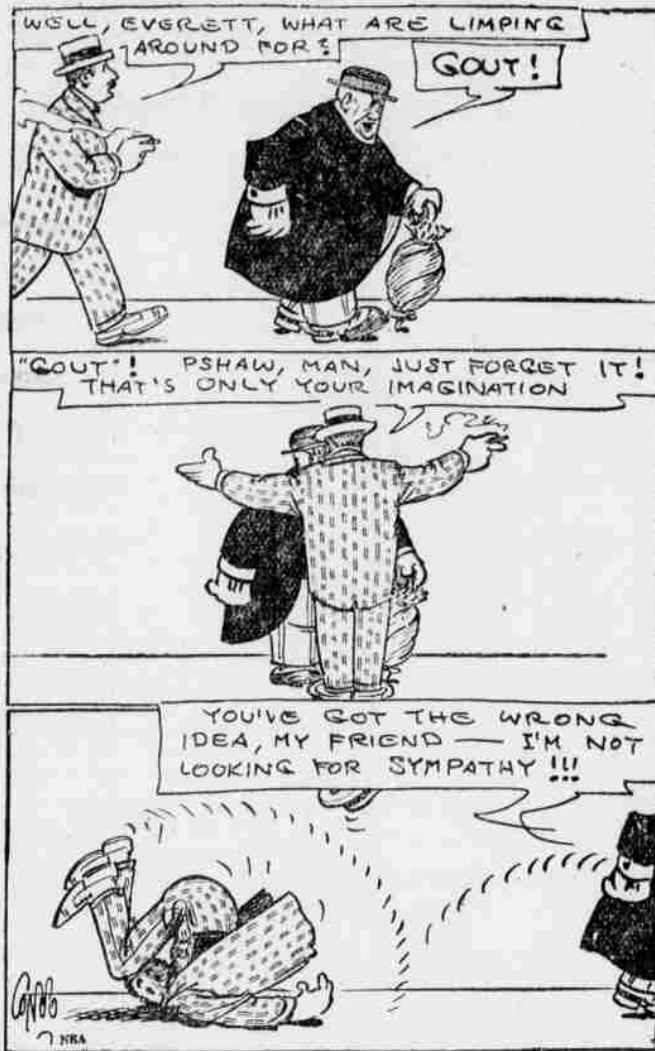

Cattle—14,000; slow; native beef steers, western grassers and she stock about steady with Tuesday's average going mostly short fed, approximately one-half run western grassers; early top matured steers, \$13.25; best yearlings, \$12; bulk native beef steers of quality and condition to sell largely at \$9 @ 11.75; bulls, slow, weak; hindling unevenly lower on veal calves; bulk desirable hologna bulls most \$4 @ 4.25; packing bidding, \$11 for desirable vealers, shippers taking few heavy calves at \$7.50.
