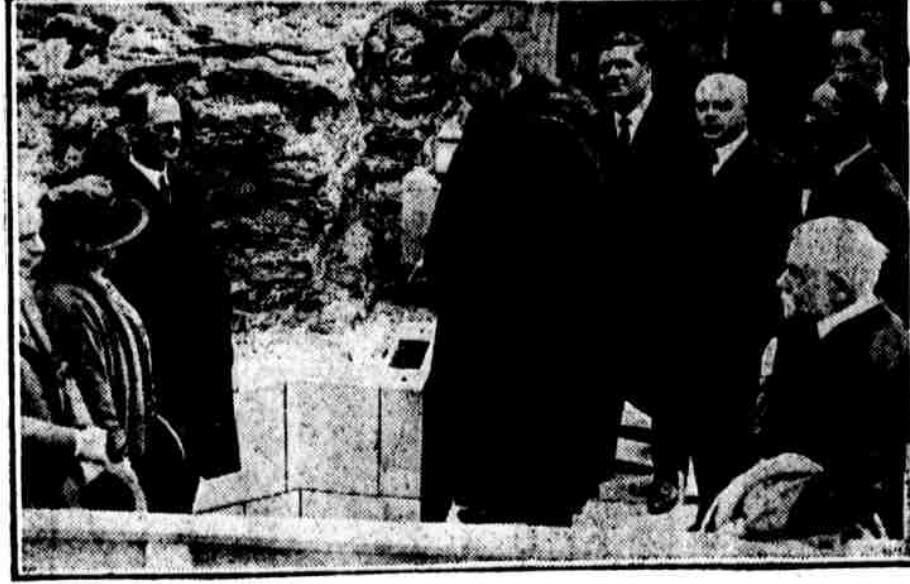

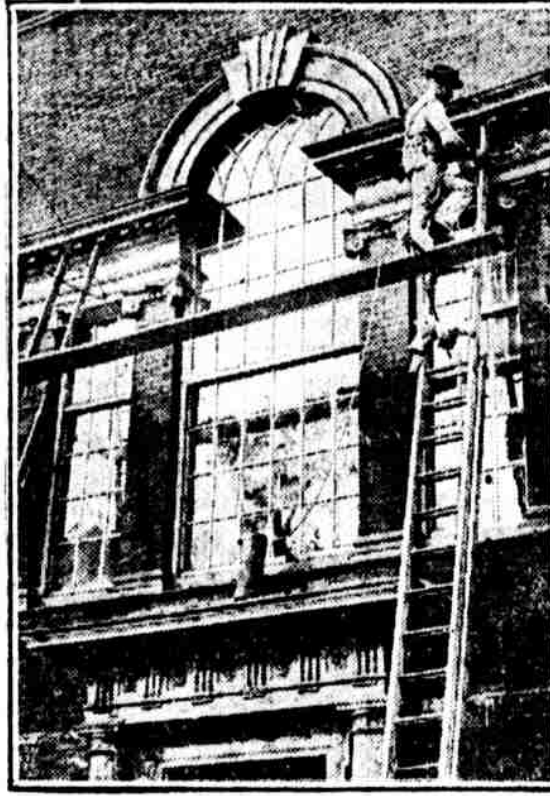
FOUND RUSTY POTATO KNIFE. John Lyons, ten-year-old boy who found knife that may figure in the New Brunswick murder mystery.



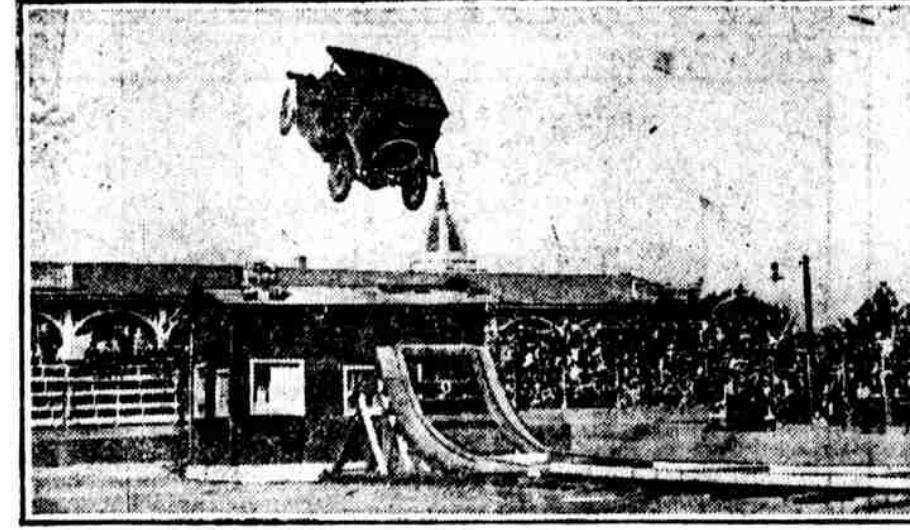

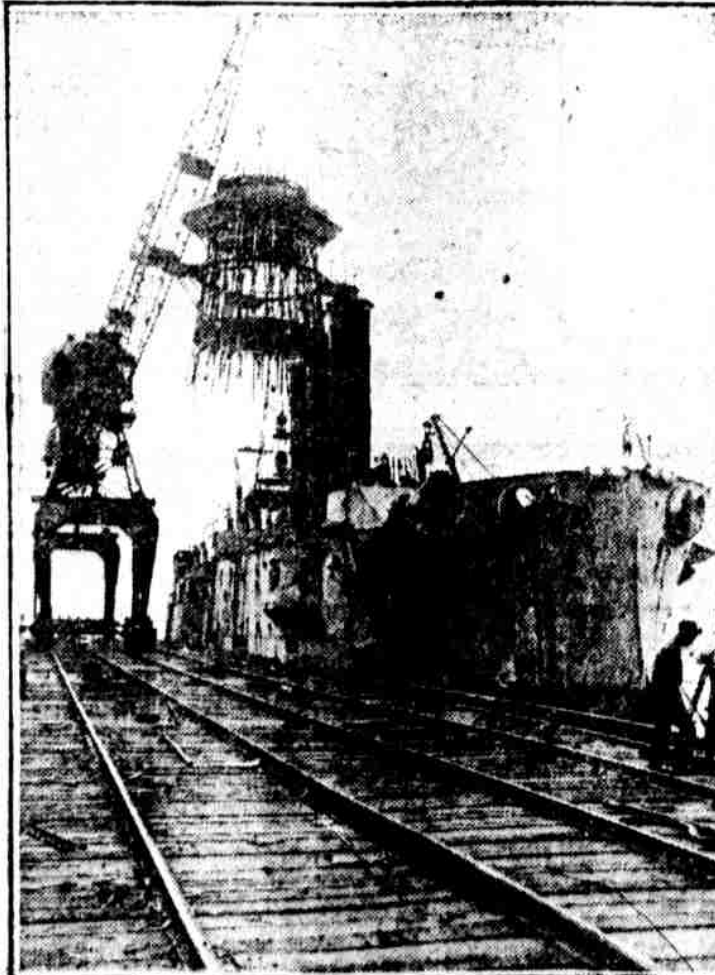
