

DEFERRED NEWS ITEMS.

The young Marquis of Bute, who will be one of the wealthiest men in the three kingdoms, has become a convert to the Roman Catholic faith.

The philantropists of Massachusetts are shipping off their unmarried white women by thousands to the far west, avowedly to find husbands, and are filling their places with emancipated woeches imported from South Carolina.

The negro stevedores of New Orleans got up a riot among themselves the other day and badly battered two policemen who undertook to rescue one of the combatants. The military were called out. It seems that the sole use of the standing army is to keep the "wards of the nation" in decent order.

Suicides of prominent men have been very frequent of late years. Within two years, Preston King, Senator James H. Lane, of Kansas, and Collector Stone, of Columbia, all leading and influential men, holding high official positions, have passed out of life through the dark door of self-slaughter.

The Sergeant-at-Arms of the New Jersey Senate, while asserting a quantity of old papers that had accumulated in the Senate Chamber during the last fifty or sixty years, discovered the official copy of the ratification of the treaty of peace between King George the Third and the United States, acknowledging the independence of the latter.

The New York Herald, speaking of the disgusting wickedness of Rev. Serene Howe, charges that "the pretended morality or humanity of Massachusetts is nothing but profound hypocrisy; that there is not so wicked a city in the world as Boston; and that, with a great outside show of decency and morality, there is a vast amount of secret vice."
