

Ocean bound Ship of 90 guns, and it is said, the Captain will be used for his life, as a Prize.

January 15. All the English transport lately returned from New-York and Quebec are captured, except about ten, which were blown out to sea.

NEW-YORK, March 20. Some Weeks ago, the House of a British Officer, about two Miles from Princetown, was plundered by a Party of Rebels, under the Command of Farmer Poole, and the Booty carried to Philadelphia where it was sold at Public Vendue for 18000. which is appropriated to the Use of the Congress.

On the Night of Sunday the 16th Inst. a Detachment of the Queen's Rangers, and New-York and a Subaltern, under the Command of Captain John Brandan, and Archibald Campbell, were ordered out to attack a Party of the Rebels at Dr. Lincey's Mill, but they, having Intelligence of the Movement of one Detachment, fled to the House of Stephen Ward, about nine Miles North from King's-Bridge, where the Party attacked them about 9 o'Clock at Night, killed between 40 and 50, and took 27 Prisoners, amongst whom were a Major, a Captain, (wounded) and a Forage Master. They brought off at the same Time, 24 Head of Cattle, and 4 Horses, Part of which they had robbed the Friends of Government of that Day. Our Loss would have been very considerable, had it not been for the Death of the brave Capt. Campbell, who, after the Villains began to Quarter, went into the House, and was immediately shot through the Heart. We had 5 Privates killed on the Spot, and 6 wounded, one of whom is since dead.

At the same Time the Piquet, under the Command of Lieut. Donlap, and Ensign Judd, marched from Fort Independence to the Bridge at Bronx River, where they attacked another Body of the Rebels, and drove them off, proceeded to Eastchester, where they took 8 Prisoners, amongst whom was Commissary Crawford, who died of his Wounds on the Road to this City. 6 Teams, and 12 Pair of Oxen. Not one of our Party were hurt.

On Sunday last, Capt. Stephen Hoyt, of the Prince of Wales's Royal American Volunteers, returned from an Expedition to Norwalk, in Connecticut, having brought from thence the Chairman of the Committee of said Place, five commissioned Officers and eight private Persons, taken in Arms, together with 15 Stands of Arms, complete, with the Loss only of one Man, who it is imagined deserted.

On Tuesday last a Party of our Troops went from Amboy to Woodbridge Roway, where they attacked a Party of the Rebels, killed a Number, routed the Rest, and brought off 70 Head of Cattle, and a Number of Sheep. We had one of the Light Infantry slightly wounded.

A considerable Firing was heard Yesterday in the Jerseys, supposed to be between one of our Foraging Parties and the Rebels, but we have not yet been able to learn the Particulars.

Tuesday, his Majesty's Ship Daphne, Captain Chennault, arrived here, from a Cruise, as did his Majesty's Ship Phoenix, Capt. Parker. The former has brought into Port, exclusive of several piratical Vessels which were burnt at Sea, a fine Ship, laden with Lead, Powder, and Cloathing, a Brig, and a large Top sail Schooner, called the Sally, William Young, Master, laden with Rum and Salt, all belonging to and bound for Philadelphia. They were taken off the Capes of Delaware.

Sir William Howe arrived in Town from the Jerseys on Sunday Afternoon the 9th Instant. His Recelery's Escort was fired upon by the Rebels in passing from Brunswick to Amboy, but were soon put to the flight about by a party of the Troops.

NEWPORT, March 27.

This Morning arrived here from New-York, the Halifax armed Brig, with a Transport under her Convoy, having on board a Number of Hessian Troops.

The Greyhound, Diamond, and Orpheus frigates, fell'd Yesterday on a Cruise.

All Accounts by the Packets which have arrived at New-York, agree that large Reinforcements may be early expected.

The 19th Instant several Persons arrived at New-York from Boston, who inform, that every Thing there was scarce and dear, and that Goods could not be bought for Paper Money.

Extract of a Letter from London, dated January 1, 1777.

"We this Day had the agreeable News of General Howe's Successes to the 26 ult. and by what we can learn, it seems as if our deluded Countrymen must soon be convinced of their Folly and Madness. We suppose they depend on the Assistance of some European Power, but from the best Intelligence I can get, they will be disappointed. The Ministry have not been negligent in watching and securing their European Neighbours, and I have no Doubt but they have fixt and Amies enough at their Service to convince the World that they are ready for a War. — I am really surpris'd to see how little this People seem to feel the Expences of the present War. Notwithstanding the Nois of Slavery, Rice, &c. &c. in the Papers, you see none where else. They seem as happy as this World can make a People. The common sense of the People seem to take a Pleasure in blaming the Ministry and faulting their Power; and the Ministry in their Turn act as if there was no Opposition. Upon the whole, I have such no Opinion of this Nation that I have had no Fears since I have been here, of their wanting Men or Money to carry any Point they are set upon."
