**FIGHT WITH SMUGGLERS OFF WILMINGTON, N. C.**—A Washington despatch to the Philadelphia Evening Telegraph says:

"A letter received from an Inspector of Customs at Wilmington, N. C., dated October 30, states that on the day previous, a vessel was observed standing out from shore at Masonborough, off Wilmington, from which a small boat was lowered. Upon this the Inspector took a boat to watch the strange craft; those in the ship's boat, finding they were discovered, went in another direction, followed by the Inspector in his boat; the smugglers, seeing they could not land without being discovered, stopped, and fired upon the revenue officer's boat. The fire was returned, but without injury to either party. The two boats then came together, when one of the smugglers struck at the Inspector with an oar, and bruised him badly. Another attempted to get into his boat, but in doing so the ship's boat was capsized, and several boxes of goods, and the three smugglers, all went to the bottom and were drowned. The smugglers were foreigners, speaking broken English, but nothing transpired as to who they were, or what was the name of the vessel, which set sail immediately afterward, and disappeared."

**CONFEDERATE TREASURY NOTES.**—Judge Erskine lately delivered an opinion in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, of some importance to the people. It was an opinion of debt on the following sealed instrument:

"\$3,000—On or before the twenty-fifth day of December next, I promise to pay Ann V. Martin, or order, three thousand dollars, for value received, as witness my hand and seal. Alatoona, January 6, 1864.  
(Signed)  
S. J. HIGHTOWER, [L. S.]  
"Superint' Bartow Iron Works."

After several pleas and demurrers, notwithstanding to the general reader, sustained and overruled, the Judge says:

"In my opinion, it is not necessary to decide whether the promise is illegal, or whether Confederate Treasury notes were prohibited by law to circulate, for it is alleged that plaintiff agreed to receive, for the amount promised, Confederate treasury notes. This being so, plaintiff cannot come into the court and ask judgment for more."

**THE FRENCH MANUFACTURERS.**—In France, some of the manufacturing districts are said to be suffering great distress. The crisis has now lasted many months in the flax trade, and has led to the closing of a great number of establishments. The state of feelings illustrated by the fact that at a large meeting of owners of spinning mills at Lisle, it was resolved to reduce their production by one-fourth, either by diminishing the number of machines, or limiting the hours of work to nine.

The London papers are complaining of the high price of food in that city. Corn has risen 20 per cent. in a month, and the prospect for winter appears decidedly bad. What the poor will do, with the rising prices of the necessities of life, is a subject they hesitate to contemplate.
