NOTED MEDICOS HEARD AT PARK

Gen. Gorgas Rousingly Greeted. Big War Problems Discussed and Plans Laid.

Crowding the new Greenleaf auditorium to its utmost capacity, the medical department of the Council of National Defense convened yesterday with over a thousand medical men in attendance.

Before the formal opening Greenleaf students crowded the hall and entertained themselves by singing under the baton of Lieut. Jones. When Gen. William C. Gorgas, surgeon-general of the American army, arrived at 11, he calmed the ovation that greeted him, complimented the singing and asked that it be continued.

Shortly after eleven, the house was called to order and Dr. Franklin Martin, who is chairman of the Council of National Defense, was introduced by Col. Henry Page, commandant of Camp Greenleaf. Dr. Martin explained the general work of the medical arm of the Council of National Defense.

Among other interesting reports were those of Dr. William H. Welch, Dr. Wm. D. Haggard, of Nashville, on Red Cross work; Dr. Wm. F. Snow on "Civilian Co-operation in Combating Venereal Diseases"; Miss Ella Phillips Crandall, of the committee on nursing.

Doctors Patriotic. A widely appreciated address was made by Col. Robert C. Vaughan, dean of medicine, University of Michigan.

Of this visit, Col. Vaughan told an odd story of the commanding-general in charge of the forces here at that time. The medical mission found typhus raging in camp, and condemned a certain well of water. The general had no faith in his medical corps and in order to show his contempt for his doctors, he very conspicuously took a drink of the forbidden water each morning.

When the doctors told the general his troops suffered from typhoid and other fevers, the soldier remarked: "Typhoid—typhoid! Do you know, sir, what Chickamauga means?" When the doctor admitted he did not, the general said: "It is an Indian word, meaning 'River of Death' and that's what the matter with my men; they've got the Chickamauga fever."

Increase Doctors Rank. Using this as an anecdote, Col. Vaughan argued the necessity of greater authority and higher rank for the doctors of an army.
