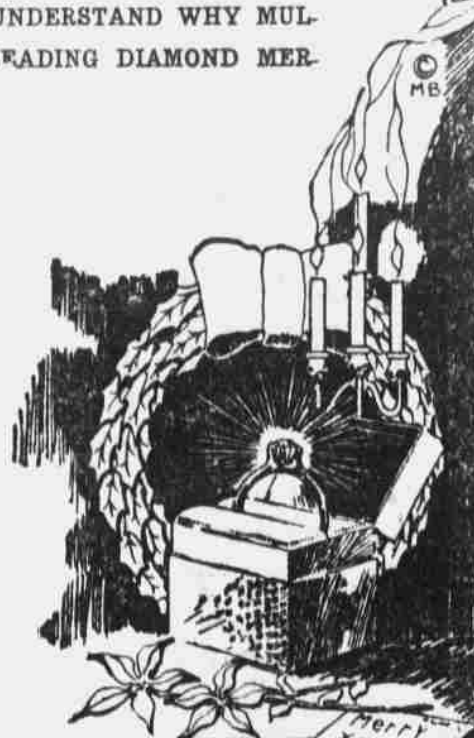

## SIBERIANS HAVE EXTENSIVE PLAN OF CO-OPERATION

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—Co-operative combinations of both producers and consumers have reached a high stage of development in Siberia. There are co-operative consumers' societies, banking organizations and farming and producing combinations, and even a union of Siberian co-operative unions.

The advance in the co-operative movement in both Russia and Siberia is so significant as to indicate that it may become a dominant factor during the period of Russian reconstruction, according to information received here by the American-Russian chamber of commerce from its representatives in Vladivostok.

The union of Siberian co-operative unions represent 8,252 co-operative consumers' stores with a total capital of 2,000,000 rubles. It has agencies in Petrograd, Moscow, Samarkand, Harbin and Vladivostok. Besides supplying its own members with merchandise which it purchases on their account, this union is developing industrial enterprises for its members and includes factories for the manufacture of wool, rubber, soap, flour and candy. It is developing its own fisheries on the Amur and Ob rivers, and operating steamers and barges.

The extent to which this union has developed is indicated by the fact that in 1918 it handled merchandise worth 3,500,000 rubles. In 1917 the turnover of merchandise was worth 42,000,000 rubles. During the first four months of 1918 its turnover of business was 23,000,000 rubles. These figures include only the operation of the central union and do not comprise the turnover of the various local co-operative societies composing the union.

Another important combination is the union of Siberian creamery associations. This is both a producers and a consumers' organization, and operates 1,187 co-operative stores. This association, according to the information received here, has played an important part in the development of the dairy and provision business in Western Siberia. Its turnover of business was 100,000 tons of butter which annually were produced in 1917 to 160,000,000 rubles in 1917. The organization has in addition to creameries, several steam flour mills, two printing establishments, and rope and soap factories, and a millinery for repairing agricultural machinery, dairy machinery and similar equipment.

The union of Siberian banking associations consists of 28 banking unions made up of 44,000 loan and savings associations. It plans to act as a purchasing agent for local co-operative societies in obtaining farming implements for the peasants. This banking association is reported to be especially interested in the development of business relations with the United States.

It is pointed out by the American-Russian chamber of commerce that American business interests should be interested in the development of co-operative movement in Russia and in developing close relationships with these important economic and commercial organizations.

### BIG INDUSTRIES BEING PLANNED FOR ENGLAND

LONDON, Dec. 19. (British Wireless Service)—Important developments are impending in England, according to the Daily Chronicle, which says that enterprises already in hand involve an expenditure of £5,000,000. Chief among these is the building of Anglo-Terran oil company. This company is preparing to spend £2,000,000 on wharves, railroad tracks and equipment in the dominions, particularly Australia and South Africa, in favor of the plan. The adoption of the elevator system for handling grain, which has been in operation for many years in the United States and Argentina, is favored, it is said.

### COURT ADJOURNS

The four circuit courts will adjourn Saturday until Jan. 2 for the Christmas holidays. Unfinished cases may be concluded in these courts Monday. The other courts will close next week.

### MUST GIVE WORK TO MAIMED, SAYS HIXSON

All social betterment organizations must work for the care of the maimed soldier who returns from the battle front. Prof. J. Hixson told members of the West Tennessee conference of home service workers at their closing meeting at the Y. M. C. A. Wednesday. He said that in other wars the heroes were

"honored" with a place on the street corner where they could sell shoe strings, but that the heroes of this struggle were to be fitted for new employments. He declared that every individual should do his utmost to aid the government in this work.

Miss Mary Able, Atlanta, Ga., of the Southern Division of the Red Cross, emphasized the need for education in the proper care of tuberculosis patients as demonstrated by the prevalence of the white plague in army camps. C. Menzler, of the state department of charities and corrections, told of the necessity for improving working conditions among families whose care fell to charitable institutions and workers.

### LECTURES AT C. OF C.

The lecture of Dr. Alexander Johnson on "Feeble-mindedness," which was given at the Y. M. C. A. Thursday night, has been transferred to the sixth floor of the Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Johnson, who was formerly superintendent of the Indiana School for Feeble-Minded Youth, now has charge of home service field work for the Southern division of the Red Cross.

### FLU BAN LIFTED.

CAMP FUNSTON, Kas., Dec. 19.—The influenza quarantine at Camp Funston was lifted today, owing to improved conditions over state. There was no epidemic at the cantonment.
