Local Lawyer Has Big Responsibility

The Memphis friends of Capt. Thomas A. Evans, formerly of the efficiency division of the quartermaster's corps, Washington, now assigned to duty with the depot quartermaster, Jeffersonville, Ind., are proud of the record he has made since entering the government service. Capt. Evans was the only member of the efficiency board, who was not mustered out soon after the armistice was signed. About 20 of the other members returned to civilian life. He made such a splendid record that he was assigned to a board of three to cancel contracts and adjust damages in the Louisville territory embracing Kentucky, Ohio, part of Illinois and part of Indiana. Some of the contracts amount to as much as \$200,000,000 and as Capt. Evans is the only lawyer on the board some idea of the extent of his responsibility may be gained from the magnitude of his labor and the extent of his territory. He is a brother of Judge Maxon Evans, also a prominent Memphis lawyer.

NAMES DEC. 24 DAY FOR RELIEF OF BLIND

Mayor Monteverde has set aside Tuesday, Dec. 24, as tag day for the blind soldiers of the great war. The tag day will be held under the auspices of the permanent blind relief war fund. S. H. Phillips, chairman of the local committee of the organization, saw the mayor Thursday and arranged the date. He also announced the committee of which he is chairman. The committee will meet to perfect final plans for the day on Monday, Dec. 23, at 7 p.m. The commissioners have been invited to attend the meeting. The tag day will be similar to that held by the Home for the Incurables in May of each year. The fund is to be expended for the education of blind soldiers in trades that will make them self-sustaining.

CALL OFF STRIKE.

MANCHESTER, England, Dec. 19.—The striking cotton operatives here held a mass meeting and decided to return at once to work. The operatives accepted the terms of an agreement by which they will receive an increase of about 20 per cent over their present wages.

WINS WAY TO CAPTAINCY THROUGH SHEER MERIT; ENLISTED AS PRIVATE

Another prominent young Memphis has been advanced from the ranks of Uncle Sam's army by sheer hard work and all-round ability. Hugh S. Buckingham, who recently received his commission as captain of his battery in the 11th field artillery, Third division, is one of the young Memphis officers of which the city is proud. Capt. Buckingham has achieved the distinction as a man from the ranks, having enlisted as a private in the Chicago Guard, First Tennessee regiment, at the outbreak of the Mexican border trouble. He later became a sergeant in the machine gun company attached to the First Tennessee, occupying this position when his regiment was mustered out at the close of the border trouble. Upon the entry of America into the world war, Capt. Buckingham entered the national service as a sergeant in the machine gun company of the First Tennessee regiment, where he won his commission as second lieutenant while his company was at Camp Ite at Nashville. When the First Tennessee later became a regiment of artillery, Capt. Buckingham received training with the same at Camp Sevier, Greenville, S. C., where he earned his commission as first lieutenant. From Greenville Capt. Buckingham was sent in advance of his regiment to a school of fire in France for special training. Capt. Buckingham participated in the active fighting at the front from St. Mihiel to the signing of the armistice and received his captaincy at the climax of the great battles in which his division was involved. His record as a soldier is one of which he and his friends may be proud.

EPIDEMIC CLAIMS 393.

HUNTSVILLE, Ala., Dec. 19. (Sp.)—The following facts with reference to deaths from pneumonia and influenza in Madison county have been given out by the health department: Deaths in September, 6; in October, 294; in November, 11; in December, 22; total, 393. The heaviest death rate was of persons between 20 and 30 years of age, the number being 82. Three persons between 20 and 30 and three persons between 30 and 50 died with the malady.

RESOLUTION SENT TO PARIS FOR WILSON TO SIGN

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19.—The first resolution of congress requiring the president's signature adopted since President Wilson sailed for the peace conference, has reached him in Paris and word that it has been signed is expected momentarily at the White House.

Secretary Tumulty was notified by cable today of the arrival of a state department courier who had in his pocket the joint congressional resolution authorizing the usual Christmas time advance payment of December salaries to government employees. Without the president's signature it would become law Saturday in time for the payments. This procedure is to be followed in the case of all acts of congress while the president is abroad.
