Read News Scimitar Wants.

BEING ITALY'S TO WORK CLOSELY

Wilson Impresses Italian Officials With Earnest Desire to See Justice Done and Thus Secure Their Aid.

PARIS, Dec. 22.—President Wilson has impressed Premier Orlando and Baron Sonnino, the foreign minister of Italy, with his earnest desire to see that justice is done in the settlement of all problems concerned with peace, and one of the results of his conference with them is a feeling of confidence that Italy will work very closely with the United States to see that the 14 points are realized. Questions of territory were not discussed at the meeting, but only general principles were mentioned to which both the Italian premier and Baron Sonnino expressed their adherence.

It is evident that Mr. Wilson is endeavoring to create an air of good feeling among statesmen upon whom the responsibility for negotiations will rest in the near future. There was no result of his conference with Premier Clemenceau that in quarters where a weakly apprehension and potential hostility existed, the feeling is now one of cordiality and sympathy for the American point of view. It was surprising if Premier Clemenceau and Mr. Wilson developed a close friendship enabling them to examine all problems in a spirit of mutual confidence.

Mr. Wilson's references to Premier Lloyd George in making his visit to England, is a courtesy that ought to impress British statesmen with the desire of the president to get in contact with them, so that English-speaking peoples may give their early support to the fundamentals of a lasting peace. The conference of Mr. Wilson with Premier Orlando and Baron Sonnino was attended by Count Maschio di Cellere, Italian ambassador to America, who acted as interpreter. The idea of a league of nations was discussed generally, the principles which ought to govern in the treatment of oppressed nationalities and struggling races in central Europe. The Italian left greatly impressed with the sense of justice manifested by Mr. Wilson, and while they projected a detailed solution of the much mooted Italian frontier, Italian public opinion is so strongly in Mr. Wilson's favor that whatever program he proposes is likely to be supported by the Italian populace.

Winning Confidence.

The Italian claim that the treaties of London drew a line which was the result of a compromise with Russia, which then represented the Slavic interests, and was made with the expectation that some day the Slavs would be a result against the Hapsburgs which would require an outlet to the sea, the Jugoslavians. The Italian declare that the latter have sufficient outlet to the Adriatic in Fiuma and that the Italian frontier which is historically an Italian city, was a concession made in the interest of Mr. Wilson's principle of justice to nations.

England and France are both pledged to give their line in question, and there is little likelihood that Mr. Wilson will insist on much change, though Italian say they are willing to discuss with him a re-formation of the frontier and leave it to him to reconcile the conflicting aspirations of the Jugoslavians and Italy.

This is but another evidence of the immense power of President Wilson as an arbitrator in the fact that he has impressed the masses with his sense of justice. The Italian government was very anxious to come to friendly relations with America and will undoubtedly follow the American program with respect to freedom of the seas and a speed to freedom of the nations. The Italians are eager to have Mr. Wilson visit their country. His plan to visit the Adriatic coast is a reflection of the frontier and leave it to him to reconcile the conflicting aspirations of the Jugoslavians and Italy.
