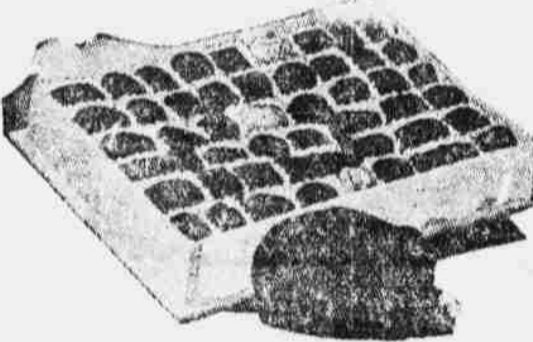

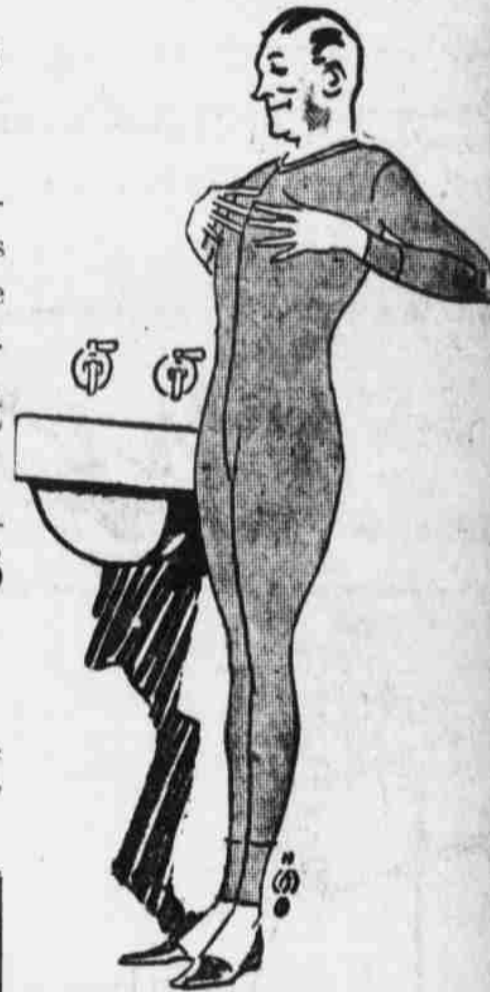

WOMAN PRAISES DEMOCRATIC VIEW

Minnesota Leader Says Party Will Appeal to New Voters in 1920.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Mrs. Peter Olson, of Cloquet, Minn., associate member of the Democratic national committee from that state, speaking at the Jackson day dinner here, said that as the home has been blessed "by the ideal of women, the world is now to feel their influence politically."
"It is safe to conjecture that the liberal parties of all nations will find favor with these newly enfranchised citizens," she said. "Women do not scoff at ideals; they believe in putting ideals into action."
"The Democratic party calls today as it did in its beginning, forward looking men and women into its ranks. During the war period, when money was spoken of in billions and America's armies in millions of men, the women of America will never forget that this Democratic administration, true to its high ideals, threw around the army camps every precaution for clean living for the soldier and they will never forget that intoxicating drinks were banished from American warships."
"Ideals are tested in time of war. The Democratic party has stood the test. Its ideals are not that property rights are paramount. It has served all classes. The progressive legislation which the women of America desire

CLARK SAYS PARTY IS ENTITLED TO VICTORY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Democratic accomplishments during the last six years entitle the party to a long lease of power," Representative Champ Clark, of Missouri, Democratic leader in the house, said at the Jackson day dinner.

"During the six years of Democratic control, he said, 'more constructive legislation was placed on the statute books than was put there in 24 years of Republican control.'
"A Democratic administration participated gloriously in the most colossal war of all times, and our brave soldiers acting under direction of a Democratic administration brought that war to a successful and glorious conclusion."
"The outstanding feature of our six years' work," he said, "is that we accomplished so much in so short a time."
"We did it by good teamwork. The Democratic congress did its duty. The great Democratic president, Woodrow Wilson, did his duty, and on the score of our record this made me confidently appeal to the voters of the land."

Palmer Sees Jury In Voters Who Will Give 1920 Verdict

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Too much evidence as to America's part in the war has been submitted, Attorney General Palmer told the Jackson day diners here, for the case to be withdrawn from the jury now.
"The great war is still a living fact," he said. "The hope of the world for peace has been blasted by the realizations of men who hold their political fortunes above the world's need. The war will not be over in fact, even if the name until the issues which it has raised are raised upon by the great court of appeals in America and the judgment of the people is entered."
"The record which has led to the issue of the war was written by the Democratic party. Upon that record we shall stand. The part which the Republican leaders have chosen to play has been merely to criticize our methods, belittle our achievements, investigate our victories and rob America and the world of their fruits. Let them also stand upon the record."
"Refraining the offer of \$10,000 made by the Republicans for the best platform, Mr. Palmer declared that if the opposition stood upon its record the platform would be composed of plans promising to 'undo all that the Democratic party has done.' Here, Mr. Palmer rebuked the acts of the Democratic administration and his criticism of lack of acts by the Republican center."
"On such a platform," he continued, "the Republican party will get all the votes it is entitled to get. It will carry almost as many states as it did in 1912."
