NEW RECORD FOR SOW FOR MAURY AUCTION IS MADE

JETT OWEN SELLS ONE FOR \$755 TO PINE CREST FARM IN MISSISSIPPI.

LITTER OF EIGHT GOES GOOD

Averaged Over \$135 Each But Many Head Offered Sold Extremely Low. First Sale in New Building at Middle Tennessee Station.

Although a record was made for the county on the sale price of a sow, and a litter of eight sold for over \$135 each, low prices, much below the worth of the offerings characterized the sale of T. J. Owen & Sons at the Middle Tennessee Experiment Station on Monday afternoon.

The fifty head sold for an average of considerably short of \$100 but a Walt's Top Colonel sow, and out of an Orion Cherry King sow sold for an aggregate of \$135.50, the eight head bringing \$1,062.50. A beautiful gilt topped the offering at \$210 while the young bear in the list sold for \$127.50. They were almost uniform in size all

though the prices ranged from as low as \$65 to \$210.

The crowd at the sale was not large, made up almost wholly of Maury countians, although several good bidders were here from other counties and states. The top sow went to Pine Crest Farm, Mississippi.

It was the first sale held in the new auditorium of the Experiment Station, which is an ideal building. All that is needed to make it the most desirable building for the purpose in the state is a good road from the pike. The building was heated and afforded every facility for the quick selling of the offerings.

Before the bidding began Prof. E. A. McLean, county agent, detailed the plans made for the campaign against scrub sires. J. I. Finney, editor of The Herald, was then introduced. He congratulated the people on the opening of the sale pavilion at the Experiment station. He made an earnest plea for better and more live stock on the farms of Maury county.

Col. Iselhardt officiated as auctioneer in his usually efficient manner. During the first part of the sale when the Orion Cherry King breeding was to the front, the bidding was spirited and prices ranged high, but to ward the close when a large offering of young gilts was made, the prices were disappointing. However, considering the fluctuations of the live pork market during recent months, the sale was a good one.

ALL IN READINESS BETTER SIRE DRIVE

COMMITTEEMEN WILL MEET AT COURT HOUSE TO MAKE FINAL PLANS FOR CAMPAIGN.

Increasing interest is being manifested by the live stock men, the feeders and breeders throughout the county, in the approaching "better sire campaign," which will be waged during the second week in February.

According to County Agent E. A. McLean, all is in readiness for the crusade. The several committeemen throughout the county have been notified to meet at the court house Saturday for the purpose of perfecting final preliminary plans for the drive to be made against the scrub sire.

As Maury county is one of the two counties in Middle Tennessee selected for an intensive campaign against the scrub sire, Prof. McLean is very anxious indeed that a good showing be made. Committeemen in the several communities of the county are very optimistic, and are confident that the week's drive in February will net splendid results.

HIGH SCHOOL BEST AUDITORIUM IN STATE

"This is the finest auditorium, the most delightful place for a public meeting that I have found in Tennessee," said Col. Harry Berry, late of the A. E. F., and who was here Monday night with the naval recruiting party, representing the United States navy. Col. Berry has been all over the state within the past two weeks with this party, from Memphis to Elizabethton, literally from Carter to Shelby, and spoken in all sorts of meeting places.

"This building is a great credit to Columbia and Maury county," continued Col. Berry, "and I am sure that your people are justly proud of it. The arrangements for light, for ventilation and for seating are ideal." As Col. Berry passed out of the building he noticed the bronze tablet in the entrance hall dedicated to the memory of the faculty and students who served in the world war. "That is fine," he said, "it shows a proper spirit and the number of members of the faculty and students on that roll is convincing proof of the patriotic ideals of this institution."

LIVE STOCK MEN TO MEET SATURDAY

WILL MAKE FINAL PLANS FOR ELIMINATION OF SCRUB SIRE IN MAURY.

County Agent McLean today is busy in mailing out notices to the committeemen in the Better Live Stock crusade, notifying them to attend the meeting to be held at the court house Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock, for the purpose of making final plans for the launching of the big campaign for the elimination of all scrub sires in Maury county during the second week in February.

Mr. McLean said today that this was perhaps the most important work to be done in Maury county this year, and that all owners, feeders and breeders of live stock should begin to talk and to think in terms of better, and pure bred stock.

Maury county has been selected by the department of extension as one of the two counties in Middle Tennessee in which a campaign is to be waged this year for the elimination of the scrub sire, and Prof. McLean is very anxious that Maury county do its full duty in the campaign.

Word comes from the several committeemen, who have been appointed to make a canvass of the county, that there is a growing sentiment in favor of the elimination of the scrub sire. Many owners of scrub sires have agreed to replace them with pure bred animals, and the owners of pure bred sires are co-operating to the fullest extent in the matter.

POCKET CHANGE TREASURE IN LAKE

DEPUTY PEBBLES TO HELP THE TAXPAYERS

WILL ASSIST ALL IN MAKING OUT THEIR INDIVIDUAL RETURNS FOR 1919.

Deputy Collector Irving Peebles, in charge of this collection district, composed of Maury, Giles, Lincoln and Marshall counties, announces that he will be in Columbia every Monday and possibly one other day during the week and for at least two weeks continuously during the period between now and March 15. When he is here Mr. Peebles will take pleasure in assisting individual income taxpayers in making their returns for the past year. All that they will have to do is to get the figures on their incomes and go to his office in the court house with their blanks and then he will assist them in filling out these blanks. This service is rendered taxpayers without any expense whatever as Mr. Peebles is paid by the federal government. Blanks for individual taxpayers have begun to arrive in the county and they are not materially different from those of last year. These returns should be made out promptly.

Notice of the time when Mr. Peebles will be in the city will be given through The Herald.

FEDERAL MEAT INSPECTORS SAFEGUARD CONSUMER.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—More than 70,000,000 animals were slaughtered under federal inspection in the last fiscal year, it is announced by the department of agriculture. This was an increase of 20.6 per cent over the total for the previous year. In all 2,588 live animals were condemned and 312,245 carcasses and 603,050 parts of

GENEROUS OFFER OF PHOENIX NATIONAL BANK

PRIZE OF \$50 FOR BEST PAIR OF PIGS FROM A JETT OWEN SOW.

At the auction sale of the Jett Owen Duroc Jersey hogs at the Middle Tennessee Experiment Station on Monday the Phoenix National Bank manifested its substantial interest in better live stock in Maury county by offering through John N. Pigg, who made the announcement to the crowd, a prize of \$50 for the best pair of pigs this year grown from a hog purchased in the sale. The award is to be made by the Duroc Jersey Association of the county. Mr. Pigg also stated that the bank would take the paper given for hogs purchased in the sale without discount.

McADOO AND HARDING SPEAK.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—World credits was the chief topic for discussion at today's session of the Pan-American financial conference here.

Former Secretary of the Treasury William G. McAdoo and Gov. W. P. G. Harding, of the federal reserve board, were the chief speakers.

McAdoo spoke on the "Credit Situation of the World." "Problems of the United States as a Creditor Nation," was Harding's theme.

Delegates from twenty Latin-American republics are attending the conference which is held for establishing closer trade and financial relations between North and South America. Eight ministers of finance are included among the delegates.
