Mr. Henry Thompson, Professor of Clinical Surgery in University College, London, has contributed a paper to the Contemporary Review in regard to the disposal of the dead in great cities, in which he advocates the burning of the bodies and saving their ashes in urchin, as less revolting than consigning them to the grave to rot and be devoured by the worms.

Of the 317,962 soldiers buried in the national cemeteries, the names of 147,823 are unknown.

The entire line of the Cumberland and Ohio Railroad between Campbellburg and Gallatin, has all been placed under contract for construction.

Bishop Keener, of New Orleans, who has recently traveled in Mexico, represents that country to be in a much more hopeful condition than is generally believed.
