**CATTLE SHIPMENTS INCREASING DAILY**

Arizona Range Cattle Reported in Poor Condition. Many Buyers.

The clearance of cattle through the port of El Paso Wednesday morning, comprised 1339 head for John T. Cameron, and a shipment of over 1000 head for the El Paso Livestock company. The cattle are in good condition, although the cattle on Arizona ranches are stated to be poor, owing to the dry weather on the ranges. Dr. Thomas A. Bray, of the bureau of animal industry, has returned from a trip to Douglas, and states that the cattle in that vicinity are not in good condition. He also states that all cattle worth shipping are being secured by buyers.

**FATHER OF JUDGE LEA DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS**

A Pioneer Missourian and Long Connected With Public Office—Judge Lea Was Present.

A telegram was received in El Paso Wednesday morning announcing the death of Tom Lea, father of police judge Tom Lea of this city, which occurred at Independence, Mo., Wednesday morning.

The deceased, who was 72 years of age and a pioneer Missourian, had been connected with the office of the county surveyor of Jackson county in that state for many years, and was a Confederate veteran.

The funeral will probably be held at Independence, where Judge Lea has been for several days in attendance upon his father. Mr. Lea had been seriously ill since his return home from El Paso where he visited his son last October.

**SENATE REFUSES TO HAVE NEW MEXICO COUNTY SEAT MOVED**

Bills Passed Annulling Action of New Mexico in Legislature as to Sierra County.

Washington, D. C., April 20.—On motion of Beveridge, the senate passed senate joint resolutions 92 and 93, disapproving two acts of the 35th New Mexico legislature changing the county seat and county lines of Sierra county. Similar bills are on the house calendar.

Delegate Cameron introduced bills prohibiting that Tempe hold an election of taxpayers to pass on an issue of \$10,000 worth of 5 percent 15 and 25 year bonds for a city hall and \$30,000 for an electric light power plant.

Delegate Stephens introduced a bill that the government hold in trust and dispose of coal oil gas and asphalt of the Choctaws and Chickasaws.
