STATE OF DERTAIN IN NEW MEXICO SAYS MILLS. Governor of Territory Says President Will Recommend It and Congress Approve.

The New Mexico constitution will be accepted by the popular vote of the people of January 21, will be recommended to congress by the president, and will be approved by congress and New Mexico will be a state by March or April at the latest.

Governor William J. Mills, of New Mexico, said so Tuesday while in El Paso and no one in the territory is in a better position to know for the governor. Gov. Mills was here on his way to Alamogordo to attend a big statehood meeting which will be held there Tuesday evening.

"I have no direct assurance from the president that he will recommend the constitution," he said. "He would hardly do that. But I have had positive assurances in an indirect way that the president approved of the measure as drafted by the constitutional convention. I am also positive that congress will approve the constitution when it is recommended to it by the president and we in New Mexico will have statehood by March or April and will call our own officers for the first time."

Will Have Good Roads, Too. Gov. Mills is also sure that New Mexico is to have good roads in the immediate future. He has been observing what Dona Ana county has been doing in the cause of good roads and says that the territory is willing to help them in their efforts to have a good highway.

A road fund is raised by a mill tax and amounts to about \$50,000 per year. If they raise too much for good roads in Dona Ana county the territory will not be able to duplicate, dollar for dollar, the funds raised by popular subscriptions. Of course we cannot devote \$50,000 or \$40,000 to the building of roads in the southern part of the territory only, for then we would have no funds on hand for the other road work. But the territory is willing to do all it can to help the Dona Ana people. The work on the Camino Real is now being confined to the northern part of the territory and it will be completed some time before it will be completed to El Paso, but it will eventually and will be a splendid highway connecting El Paso with New Mexico and the north."

Gov. Mills was accompanied to El Paso by Maj. W. H. H. Llewellyn, of Las Cruces; E. L. Medler, of Albuquerque; H. O. Bureau, of Socorro, N. M., who is chairman of the Republican central committee of New Mexico. Speeches will be made at the meeting by these men and others, including former governor George Curry, of Tularosa. The meeting will be non-partisan.

NO ALTERATION IN SEWAGE PLANT PLAN. The specifications and contracts of Sorenson & Morgan and W. E. Anderson, whose bids were accepted for the construction of the city's new garbage and sewage disposal plant, will not be changed. The statement was made Tuesday morning by mayor Kelly.

The location has not been announced. The contracts for the construction of the plant are ready for signing, it is said, but action will be deferred until all plans for the plant are definitely arranged.
