TO ARBITRATE TROUBLE

Between Telegraphers and Illinois Central Officials---Commission Has the Power.

(Herald Special.)
Washington, D. C., Jan. 10.—Chairman Knapp of the Interstate Commerce Commission and Labor Commissioner Neill have selected B. H. Myer, president of the railroad commission of Wisconsin, as the third member of the committee to arbitrate the difference between the Illinois Central railroad and the telegraphers. The committee will begin their work in Chicago this week. After this case is disposed of a third man will be named to hear similar troubles on the Big Four road.

Supreme Court Decision.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 10.—The Interstate Commerce Commission has the power to regulate the distribution of coal by railroads, according to a decision handed down today by the supreme court. The court overruled the suit by the Alton and other railroads protesting against the order of the commission telling the roads not to include coal cars in the list of available cars for pro rata distribution.

LAND FRAUD TRIAL IS ON

Binger Hermann Placed on Trial Today In Portland, Oregon—Two Previously Convicted.

(Herald Special.)
Portland, Ore., Jan. 10.—Accused of conspiracy to defraud the government in connection with the Oregon land fraud cases, Binger Hermann, former member of congress, was placed on trial in the United States district court here today. Hermann was indicted together with Senator Mitchell, H. A. Smith, both deceased, and ex-State Senator Mays, Representative Jones and George S. Sorensen. The latter two were convicted in 1906, the Hermann trial being postponed. Hermann is alleged to have conspired to have two hundred thousand acres of land in Oregon set aside as a forest reserve, transferred. The prosecution is under the direction of Francis J. Heney, famous for his prosecutions in the west and in San Francisco. Hermann was formerly a member of congress, a former commissioner of public lands, and for years a prominent figure in northwestern politics.

POLICE ARE MYSTIFIED

Son of a Rock Island Railroad Man Found Dead Sunday In a Questionable Resort.

Chicago, Ill., Jan. 10.—The police department is bending its energies today to the effort of untangling the mystery surrounding the death of Nathaniel Ford Moore, aged twenty-six years, who was found dead yesterday in a resort here. Marks of violence were in evidence and the police are convinced that the young man was the victim of foul play. It is believed that the investigation will lead to wholesale arrests in the red light district.

Two Arrests Made.

Chicago, Jan. 10.—Victoria Shaw, the keeper of the resort where Moore's body was found, was arrested today with Pearl Dorsel, the inmate of the house who found Moore's body. The coroner's physicians who examined the body of Moore refuse to give any information as the result of their inquiry. One physician said privately that death was probably due to heart failure. Helen Fargo Moore, the wealthy and beautiful wife of Moore, is prostrated over the tragedy, and is in a critical condition this afternoon. She married Moore after a romantic courtship following their meeting together in an auto trip through Virginia.

BALLOONS AND AIRSHIPS

Get Away on Record Tests at Los Angeles—New York First Balloon to Get Away.

Los Angeles, Cal., Jan. 10.—Thousands of people gathered here today for the opening of the aviation meet. The first balloon to get under way this morning was the New York, with Clifford Harmon as pilot. It was soon followed by the Peoria, piloted by Lanne. This afternoon fourteen aeronauts demonstrated their machines, the beginning of the elimination trials. Curtiss and Paulham expect to break all previous records.

GOT TRIAL DELAYED.

District Attorney Fickert Asked That Calhoun Trial Be Delayed.

San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 10.—On motion of District Attorney Fickert the trial of Patrick Calhoun, the street railway magnate of San Francisco, accused of attempted bribery in connection with street car franchises, was postponed until the last of the month. Fickert said he was not familiar with the record of the case, and wanted time to investigate. Calhoun is the man tried by Francis J. Heney. Heney was defeated in his race for district attorney by Frickert.

RELIGIOUS POWERS

Granted By the Pope In a Decree Just Issued—Concerning Marriages of Catholics.

Rome, Jan. 10.—A decree has been issued by the pope granting important powers to all bishops of the church throughout the world. The new decree gives the bishops the right to settle all questions regarding the marriage of Catholics without reference to the authorities.

SCHOOL BUILDINGS BURNED.

Four Hundred Pupils Driven From Their Beds into Snow Drifts.

Newburg, N. Y., Jan. 10.—Four hundred students were driven from their beds into snow drifts and the cold by a fire which early this morning destroyed the main buildings of the military academy of Cornwall. The loss will reach two hundred thousand dollars. No casualties occurred because of the splendid discipline.

SUGAR MEN SENTENCED

Men Convicted of Defrauding Government In Sugar Weighing Given One Year Sentences.

New York, Jan. 10.—In the United States circuit court today Judge Martin sentenced Thomas Kethoe, Patrick J. Hennessey, John R. Boyle and Edward A. Coyle, former checkers at the Williamsburg docks of the sugar trust who were convicted of manipulating the scales whereby the government was defrauded of duties, to one year each in the penitentiary. Oliver Spitzer, convicted with the above men, will be sentenced on the first of February. He is now in a hospital recovering from a surgical operation.

Indiana Democratic Banquet.

Lafayette, Ind., Jan. 10.—Democrats great and small, from many parts of Indiana, are to worship tonight at the shrine of democracy's patron saint, Andrew Jackson, the occasion being the annual banquet of the Jackson Club of this city. A number of state officials and other democratic leaders of Indiana are to be included among the speakers.
