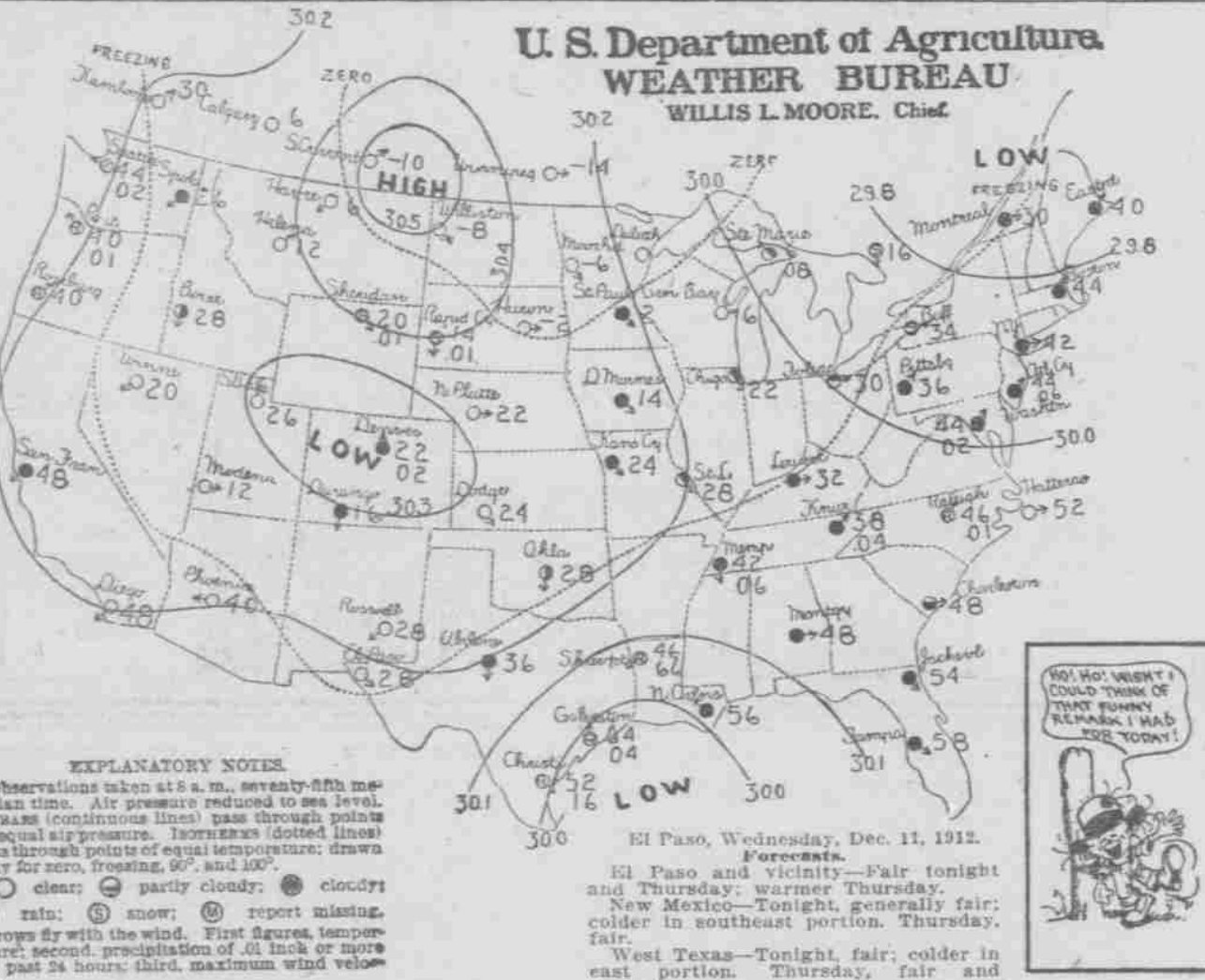

EL PASO GIVE THEIR ENDORSEMENT OF OPTOMETRY LAW Having been informed that an optometry bill will be introduced in the next legislature, the objects of which will be the regulation of the practice of opticians, who fit glasses to the eyes, requiring them to qualify before a state board of examiners, the primary object being to protect the public, the standard of this calling, but to also eliminate the transient spectacle fakers, a number of El Pasoans have endorsed such a measure, "believing such a law will greatly benefit the general public, according to the endorsement.
